The core offer enables the Council to maintain its statutory obligations.

DOES THIS DIFFER FROM THE CURRENT SERVICE?

The additional workload in relation to Individual Electoral Registration has been managed within existing resource. It is not possible for the Council to meet its statutory obligations with less than the current service levels. All staff are multi-skilled and Elections/Electoral Registration are part of their core role. Staff also manage the Democratic processes of the Council.
