### CONTRACTS UNDERTAKEN FOR EXTERNAL CLIENTS IN 2004/2005

#### **Purpose of Report**

1. To advise Cabinet of work undertaken by Community Services for external clients during 2004/2005.

#### Summary

2. This report firstly provides details of contracts and works orders for external clients, valued at less than £75,000 entered into by the Director of Community Services under delegated powers for the financial year 2004/2005. The second part of the report summarises the outcome of tenders for external clients, in excess of £75,000, which were subject to Tendering Panel approval.

### **Information and Analysis**

3. A summary of minor works undertaken with an individual contract or works order value of less than £75,000 during 2004/2005 is provided below with more comprehensive details in **Appendix 1**.

- 4. For works greater than £75,000 in value, there was one relevant contract won in this period. This involved a contract to build the Walk-in Centre in Kings Street, for the Primary Care Trust which was valued at just under £1.4m.
- 5. For comparison purposes, the turnover for external clients for 2003/04 was:-
  - (i) Contracts less that £75,000 turnover was £626,792.
  - (ii) Contracts greater than £75,000, turnover was £1,300,000.
