Issue to address: Limited range of provision leading to formal accreditation, Only 5 out of 7 youth centres offer formal accreditation. In centre based provision, activities often poorly organised with insufficient analysis of young peoples needs; sessions poorly planned and executed with over reliance on unstructured activities; too many youth workers inexperienced with insufficient skills & do not provide opportunities for young people to be involved in planning, providing and reviewing session and programmes.
