(a) Girlguiding UK

This year is the centenary of Girlguiding UK and they are arranging a number of events throughout the country to highlight that 2010 is a special year for them. The Executive Committee of Guildguiding Durham South has challenged itself to have guiding depicted in as many flowerbeds throughout the county as possible in cities, towns and villages where guiding units meet. In Darlington, there are over 1200 members from age 5 to over 75.
