 - (a) Quakers Running Club

The Quakers Running Club is one of two athletics club in the town. They have a membership of approximately 230 members, consisting of both senior and junior athletes. They promote all types of athletic activities and provide opportunities for both recreational and competitive athletes. A major part of their development programme is to put members through coaching courses to benefit the club and its membership both now and in the future. They are seeking £200 to put three members through UK Athletics Level One and Level Two coaching courses.

(b) Darlington 21st All Stars Junior Football Club

21st All Stars are a long established junior football club in Darlington. The club has over 250 members who play in 15 teams ranging from under 8's to 17 year olds. They are seeking £200 towards the costs, which are £80 per person.
