# REVENUE AND CAPITAL MEDIUM TERM FINANCIAL PLANS, REVENUE BUDGET AND COUNCIL TAX 2005-06 - TIMETABLE

## **Purpose**

1. To agree a timetable for review of the Medium Term Financial Plans and production of the Council's 2005-06 Revenue Budget, Council Tax and Housing Revenue Account.

## **Information**

## Revenue MTFP and 2005-06 budget

- 2. The Council is required to formally determine its revenue budget requirement and set the Council Tax for the coming financial year before 11th March. In accordance with good practice and sound financial planning, this Council has developed a medium term framework within which decisions about the coming year's revenue budget are made.
- 3. The annual Local Government Finance Settlement is critical to determining the level of resources available to the Authority. The provisional settlement for 2005-06 is expected to be announced in late November 2004.
- 4. A draft timetable has been produced that takes account of the tight timescales between the provisional settlement announcement and the statutory deadlines for setting the 2005-06 budget requirement. The proposed timetable is: -

## Capital

- 6. It is proposed that the timetable for developing the capital MTFP runs in parallel with the revenue MTFP because of its revenue implications. The scoring mechanism used to assess bids is the same as that used last year, updated to reflect the recent Darlington Community Survey results.
