The process

- May 2007 LSP agree project management arrangements
- Led by LSP a Partnership document
- Data pack and other evidence
- Enquiry Group process
- Engagement and prioritisation



Data collection

- Government priorities
- Regional/sub-regional plans
- Local Service and Business Plans e.g. Policing Plan
- Inspections
- Performance data, e.g. analysis of existing Community Strategy themes
- Darlington specific data, e.g. demographics, parish plans, etc.



Enquiry Group process

- Darlington Partnership Board established 6
 Enquiry Groups to address priority issues for Darlington
- Chaired independently, key support from DBC employees
- Aim to give practical solutions
- Common themes across enquiry groups would be recognised



The Enquiry Groups

- **EG1** How can we develop the **economy** and grow high quality jobs in Darlington?
- **EG2** What is needed to ensure Darlington has the best **education** in the UK producing the workforce for a high value economy?
- **EG3** How can we make Darlington **crime free** and reduce anti-social behaviour?
- **EG4** How can we make Darlington the healthiest place in the UK by persuading people to adopt **healthy** lifestyles?
- EG5 What would it take to make Darlington the greenest place in the UK?
- **EG6** How can we maximise **life chances** and choices throughout Darlington and ensure continuous improvement for priority people and places through a joined-up approach?



Engagement and prioritisation

- Extensive community engagement summer 2007
- 42 events range of public meetings
- Employee focus groups held
- Views captured on postcards, online, via competition entries, etc.
- Database of views held for analysis



Prioritisation

- 13 topic areas identified from the preconsultation
- Interactive prioritisation September November 2007
- Follow up focus groups with employees, public meetings, Citizens' Panel, Darlington Assembly
- Not a simple average!!
- Results combined with data collection and Enquiry Groups process to produce the draft content

Priorities	3 Themes from a list of 8	2 priorities that will help shape decision making
Themes	8	5 clearly identified from extensive consultation
Priority Groups	Separate consideration of 3 priority groups	Single Strategy to include NRS
Delivery	3 year rolling action plan updated annually	Short term (LAA – 3 years) Medium term (MTFP– 5 years) Long term - Vision
Feeling	Doing everything at once	Fewer, clearer priorities structured in short, medium & long term plans



The Vision

At this stage in drafting, there is not yet a clear statement of this vision, although it encompasses the following:

- A prosperous and empowered community founded on its rich tradition of enterprise and innovation;
- The opportunities, ambition and vibrant life of a city;
- The quality of life and history of a friendly market town;
- Successful, innovative and enterprising businesses;
- Easy and sustainable access by road, rail and air for everybody



Priorities and themes

Two priorities, helping to shape decision making:

The vision – describing Darlington as a **place** and helping us to shape investment decisions and spatial planning

One Darlington – describing our approach to **people**, and specifically narrowing the gap between the most disadvantaged people and communities and the rest of the borough

5 themes:

- Prosperous Darlington
- Aspiring Darlington
- Healthy Darlington
- Greener Darlington
- Safer Darlington



Next Steps

Developing a new Local Area Agreement, acting as the delivery plan for the new Sustainable Community Strategy

- Up to 35 indicators from the new National Indicator list;
- Action planning for delivery of Sustainable Community
 Strategy actions

2 months consultation on the draft Sustainable Community Strategy – December and January

Final Strategy to LSP Board, Cabinet and Council in March
