- 6. The suggested area for Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee is to look at is teenage pregnancy and Conception rates and social and health education in schools.
- 7. Taking the above into account, it is therefore suggested that this Scrutiny Committee establishes a Task and Finish Review Group to look into this.
- 8. In view of the timescales to undertake this Task and Finish Review it is proposed to hold a meeting of the Review Group on Monday, 21st June, 2010 at 4.00 p.m. and Membership of that group is now being sought.

The findings of the Group will need to be reported back to Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee and the Health and Well Being Scrutiny Committee as it is the intention that all the final reports which individual Scrutiny Committees produce will be appended to the Director of Public Health's report. Progress on the review will be reported regularly to the Monitoring and Co-ordination Group.
