HP23. MEDUIM TERM FINANCIAL PLAN TASK AND FINISH REVIEW GROUP FINAL REPORT – The Director of Resources submitted a report (previously circulated) presenting the outcome and findings of the Task and Finish Review Group established by the Health and Partnerships Scrutiny Committee to scrutinise those saving proposals contained within the Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP) which were under the remit of Health and Partnerships Scrutiny Committee.
