CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE SCRUTINY COMMITTEE PERFORMANCE REPORT 2ND QUARTER 2009/10

Purpose of Report

- 1. For members of the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee to:
 - (a) scrutinise the four service plans for which this Committee is responsible for monitoring, i.e. Children & Families, Partnerships, Planning & Resources and School Improvement & Development, and;
 - (b) scrutinise those elements of the Sustainable Community Strategy, One Darlington: Perfectly Placed and Local Area Agreement for which the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee have responsibility for.

Summary

- 2. This report takes a slightly different approach to previous reports in that it includes performance for previous periods, where data is not available for this quarter. The National Indicator Set (NIS) is not readily updated on a quarterly basis and so it is felt that this approach will provide more useful information. In addition the latest data is also shown for SCS and LAA indicators. The pie charts will therefore show this information although the overall status of the service plans will just be based on quarter 2 data as will the exception reporting.
- 3. The overall aggregated target for the four service plans is being achieved, with the Partnerships plan showing above target performance. Data is available for 97 indicators at quarter 2. There are 150 indicators in the four service plans and of these 45 are above target, 68 on target and 32 are showing below target performance. Data is unavailable for five indicators.
- 4. There are seven indicators performing below target in Children & Families. These are: looked after children absent from school, young offenders engaged in education, training or employment, the percentage of initial assessments for children's social care carried out within seven days, the percentage of core assessments for children' social care carried out within 35 days, children missing from home or care, care leavers in suitable accommodation and care leavers in education, employment or training.
- 5. There are also seven indicators performing below target in the Partnerships service plan. These are adults learners from targeted wards, number of childcare web hits, number of public IT sessions provided by the library service, the percentage of schools that have a drug and alcohol policy delivering related education, the percentage of schools achieving National Healthy Schools Status, percentage of schools providing access to extended services and 16-18 year olds not in education, employment or training (NEET).

- 6. In Planning and Resources service plan there is one indicator performing below target, which is the percentage of schools satisfied with the authority's home to school transport.
- 7. There are five indictors below target in the School Improvement & Development service plan. These are the percentage of pupils achieving at least 5 GCSE A*-C including English and Mathematics, the number of schools in special measures, narrowing the gap between lowest achieving 20% in the Early Years Foundation Stage and the rest, key stage 2 attainment for BME groups and the rate of permanent exclusions from school
- 8. Data is also presented for this Committee's scrutiny responsibilities with regard to the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS) and Local Area Agreement (LAA).
- 9. Three indicators are reporting performance for the SCS: the percentage of pupils achieving five or more GCSE grades A*-C including English and Mathematics is performing below target, whilst the two indictors measuring the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at key stage 2 and key stage 4 are above target.
- 10. With regard to the LAA there are 16 indicators in total with eight reporting performance at quarter 2 and of these six are on target and two below target.
- 11. Finally, those national indicators aligned to the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee are presented, with any areas of underperformance highlighted.

Recommendations

- 12. Members are asked to:
 - (a) consider performance against the service plans and use this to inform their scrutiny of services;
 - (b) set up task and finish groups as necessary to scrutinise performance in identified services and/or for individual performance indicators as decided;
 - (c) consider performance against the Sustainable Community Strategy and Local Area Agreement for those indicators which the Committee is responsible for scrutinising and note the overall performance, with reasons for under performance detailed in **Appendix 1,** and ;
 - (d) note the performance of all national indicators linked to all this scrutiny committee where data is available, as outlined in **Appendix 2**.





- 13. For 2009/10 the service plans that this Committee has responsibility for monitoring are Children & Families, Partnerships, Planning & Resources and School Improvement & Development.
- 14. Overall, aggregated performance of the four service plans is on target as are the individual service plans apart from Partnerships which is showing above target performance.

Areas of underperformance

16. There are a total of 20 indicators currently below target, reasons for which are detailed in **Appendix 1**.

Sustainable Community Strategy - One Darlington: Perfectly Placed

- 17. This report gives a high level overview of performance against relevant indicators contained within the Sustainable Community Strategy. Of 15 high level indicators contained within the Strategy, four (one has two parts) are linked to Children & Young People Scrutiny.
- 18. Data is available for three indicators: NI 102i achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 2 and NI 102ii achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4 are performing above target. NI 75 achievement of 5 or more GCSE A*-C including English and Mathematics is below target.



National Indicator Set


20. There are currently 188 national indicators of which 64 are linked to the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee. It should be noted that a number of indicators have

- more than one part so the actual number reported on is 78. Overall across the entire basket of national indicators, performance is on target for those indicators reporting data.
- 21. Of the 78 Children & Young People related National Indicators, analysis shows that there are ten above target, 21 on target, twelve below target and 35 where data is unavailable. As previously the pie chart below uses previous data in lieu of quarter 2 data.
