
CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE SCRUTINY COMMITTEE
PERFORMANCE REPORT 3RD QUARTER 2009/10

Purpose of Report

1. For members of the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee to:
 - (a) scrutinise the four service plans for which this Committee is responsible for monitoring, i.e. Children & Families, Partnerships, Planning & Resources and School Improvement & Development, and;
 - (b) scrutinise those elements of the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS), One Darlington : Perfectly Placed and Local Area Agreement (LAA) for which the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee have responsibility.

Summary

2. This report includes analysis of data available at quarter 3 and also uses the latest data available represented in the pie charts, although the overall status of the service plans will just be based on quarter 3 data as will the exception reporting.
3. The overall aggregated target for the four service plans is being achieved, with the Partnerships plan showing above target performance. Data is available for 100 indicators at quarter 3 with 32 performing above target, 42 on target and 26 below target. Using latest data there are 150 indicators in the four service plans and of these 43 (29%) are above target, 69 (46%) on target and 38 (25%) are showing below target performance.
4. There are nine indicators performing below target in Children & Families:
 - Looked after children absent from school;
 - Adoptions of children looked after;
 - Young offenders engaged in education, training or employment
 - The percentage of initial assessments for children's social care carried out within seven days,
 - The percentage of core assessments for children's social care carried out within 35 days,
 - The number of moves of looked after children,
 - Children missing from home or care,
 - Care leavers in suitable accommodation, and;
 - Care leavers in education, employment or training.
5. There are six indicators performing below target in the Partnerships service plan:
 - Adult learners from targeted wards;
 - Number of childcare web hits;
 - Percentage of schools achieving National Healthy Schools Status;
 - Use of public libraries;

- Percentage of schools providing access to extended services, and;
 - 16-18 year olds not in education, employment or training (NEET).
6. In Planning and Resources service plan there are two indicators performing below target:
 - Percentage of schools satisfied with the authority's home to school transport, and
 - Percentage of complaints resolved at stage 1.
 7. There are nine indicators below target in the School Improvement & Development service plan:
 - The percentage of pupils with at least 78 points at Early Years Foundation Stage,
 - The percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above in both English and mathematics at Key Stage 2,
 - The percentage of pupils achieving at least 5 GCSE A*-C including English and Mathematics,
 - The number of schools in special measures, time taken for schools to come out of special measures,
 - Narrowing the gap between lowest achieving 20% in the Early Years Foundation Stage and the rest,
 - Progression by 2 levels in mathematics between key stages 1 and 2, key stage 2 attainment for BME groups, and;
 - The rate of permanent exclusions from school.
 8. Data is also presented for this Committee's scrutiny responsibilities with regard to the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS) and Local Area Agreement (LAA).
 9. Three indicators are reporting performance for the SCS: the percentage of pupils achieving five or more GCSE grades A*-C including English and Mathematics is performing below target, whilst the two indicators measuring the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at key stage 2 and key stage 4 are above target.
 10. With regard to the LAA there are 16 indicators in total with eleven reporting performance at quarter 3 and of these two are above target, seven on target and two below target.
 11. Finally, those national indicators aligned to the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee are presented, with any areas of underperformance highlighted.

Recommendations

12. Members are asked to:
 - (a) consider performance against the service plans and use this to inform their scrutiny of services;
 - (b) set up task and finish groups as necessary to scrutinise performance in identified services and/or for individual performance indicators as decided;
 - (c) consider performance against the Sustainable Community Strategy and Local Area Agreement for those indicators which the Committee is responsible for scrutinising and note the overall performance, with reasons for under performance detailed in **Appendix 1**, and ;
 - (d) note the performance of all national indicators linked to all this scrutiny committee where data is available, as outlined in **Appendix 2**.

Areas of underperformance

16. In the overall service view there are 38 indicators showing below target performance. However, in terms of 3rd quarter performance, there are a total of 26 indicators below target. Reasons for these levels of performance are detailed in **Appendix 1**.

Sustainable Community Strategy – One Darlington : Perfectly Placed

17. This report gives a high level overview of performance against relevant indicators contained within the Sustainable Community Strategy. Of 15 high level indicators contained within the Strategy, four (one has two parts) are linked to Children & Young People Scrutiny.
18. Data is available for three indicators: NI 102i achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 2 and NI 102ii achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4 are performing above target. NI 75 achievement of 5 or more GCSE A*-C including English and Mathematics is below target.

Local Area Agreement

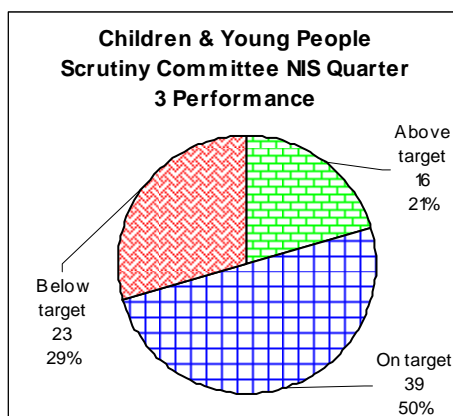
19. The Local Area Agreement is made up of 35 negotiated indicators and ten statutory early years and children and young people indicators, of which sixteen are linked to Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee. National Indicator Set

20. There are currently 188 national indicators of which 64 are linked to the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee. It should be noted that a number of indicators have more than one part so the actual number reported on is 78. Overall across the entire basket of national indicators, performance is on target for those indicators reporting data.
21. Of the 78 Children & Young People related National Indicators, analysis shows that at quarter 3 there are eleven above target, 25 on target, 15 below target and 27 where data is unavailable. As previously the pie chart below uses previous data in lieu of quarter 3 data.


