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PERFORMANCE REPORT 3RD QUARTER 2010/11

Purpose of Report

- 1. For members of the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee to:
 - (a) scrutinise the four service plans for which this Committee is responsible for monitoring, i.e. Children & Families, Early Intervention & Prevention, Planning & Resources and School Improvement & Development, and;
 - (b) scrutinise those elements of the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS), One Darlington: Perfectly Placed for which the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee have responsibility.

Summary

- 2. This report includes analysis of data available at quarter 3 2010/11 and also uses the latest data available represented in the pie charts, although the overall status of the service plans will just be based on quarter 3 data as will the exception reporting.
- 3. The overall aggregated target for the four service plans is being achieved, with the Planning & Resources plan showing above target performance. Data is available for 96 out of 141 indicators at quarter 3 with 23 performing above target, 49 on target and 24 below target. Using latest data for the 141 indicators in the four service plans 31 (22%) are above target, 78 (55%) on target and 31 (22%) are showing below target performance. Data is not available for one indicator.
- 4. There are ten indicators performing below target in Children & Families:
 - (a) Looked after children absent from school.
 - (b) Looked after children who had been looked after continuously for at least 2.5 years who were living in the same placement for at least 2 years.
 - (c) Adoptions of looked after children.
 - (d) The percentage of initial assessments for children's social care carried out within seven days.
 - (e) Stability of placements of looked after children number of moves.
 - (f) Stability of placements of looked after children length of placement.
 - (g) Children looked after for 4 years or more who were in a foster care placement for 2 years or more.
 - (h) Child protection plans lasting two years or more.
 - (i) Children becoming the subject of a child protection plan for a second or subsequent time.
 - (j) Gap between special educational need pupils and their peers at Key Stage 2 English and maths threshold.

- 5. There are seven indicators performing below target in the Early Intervention & Prevention service plan:
 - (a) Percentage of half-day sessions missed due to total absence in primary schools.
 - (b) Adult learners from targeted wards.
 - (c) Number of child care web hits.
 - (d) Number of young people supported who are at risk.
 - (e) Children and young people's participation in high-quality PE and sport.
 - (f) Secondary school persistent absence rate.
 - (g) 16-18 year olds not in education, employment or training (NEET).
- 6. There are seven indictors below target in the School Improvement & Development service plan:
 - (a) The percentage of permanently excluded pupils provided with more than 21 hours of alternative tuition.
 - (b) Percentage of childminders judged as good or better by Ofsted.
 - (c) The percentage of pupils achieving at least 5 GCSE A*-C including English and maths.
 - (d) Narrowing the gap between lowest achieving 20% in the Early Years Foundation Stage and the rest.
 - (e) Achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 2.
 - (f) Key stage 2 attainment for BME groups Gypsy, Roma and Travellers of Irish heritage.
 - (g) Key stage 4 attainment for BME groups Gypsy, Roma and Travellers of Irish heritage.
- 7. Data is also presented for this Committee's scrutiny responsibilities with regard to the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS).
- 8. Three indicators are reporting performance for the SCS at quarter 2: the percentage of pupils achieving five or more GCSE grades A*-C including English and Mathematics and the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 2 are performing below target. The indicator measuring the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4 is performing above target.

Recommendations

9. Members are asked to:

- (a) consider performance against the service plans and use this to inform their scrutiny of services;
- (b) set up task and finish groups as necessary to scrutinise performance in identified services and/or for individual performance indicators as decided;
- (c) consider performance against the Sustainable Community Strategy for those indicators which the Committee is responsible for scrutinising and note the overall performance, with reasons for under performance detailed in **Appendix 1**.


