Review Groups

- Young Carers Following approval by Members of this Scrutiny Committee to establish a Task and Finish Review Group to undertake a piece of work in relation to the transition from young to adult carers, jointly with 2 Members from the Adults and Housing Scrutiny Committee, the Chair has agreed with officers to postpone commencing this Review until the Young Carers Service (which was transferred from the YMCA to DISC on 1st September, 2013) has had chance for the new service providers to familiarise themselves with the Young Carers Action Plan.
- 8. Child Poverty Following the initial meeting of this Review Group, arrangements are being made to hold a second meeting to discuss further the issues raised.

Financial Sustainability of Local Authorities

- 9. At the request of Monitoring and Co-ordination Group, the Chair and Vice-Chair met with the relevant officers to discuss the Financial Sustainability of Local Authorities report from the National Audit Office with particular attention to the spend for Children's Social Care, which had shown an increased spend, and the reasons for this increase.
- 10. It was agreed that this situation will be monitored through the Budget Consultation Process.
