Drivers for change

- New Force Operating Model
- New procedures/processes
- Wider harm caused by alcohol misuse
- Improve Partnership working
- Increase public confidence



Incident Data for Darlington

- 35, 779 incidents (last 12 months)
- 5109 incidents of ASB (14.2%)
- 3553 incidents alcohol related (10%)
- 779 incident ASB alcohol related (15.2%)
- 492 drug related incidents (1.3%)



Darlington Crime Data

- 7,049 recorded crimes
- 2,561 detected (outcomes) 36.3%
- 884 violence crimes (12.5%)
- 509 violence outcomes (57.5%)
- 3914 prisoners processed in Custody (+ 640 VA + other stations)
- 41% affected by alcohol or Drugs



Local research

- Local figure for violent crime could higher due to recording issues
- Alcohol related violence around 50% (BCS)
- Over 35% of those arrested are under the influence of alcohol



cont

- Weekends after 10pm <u>all</u> prisoners affected by alcohol
- 62% of prisoners arrested on Saturday affected by alcohol (recent snapshot)
- Officer survey 60% say at least 50% of their time spent on Alcohol related issues



Costs

- £22.1 billion for alcohol misuse nationally per year
- £7.6 billion nationally for crime and licensing
- £15.4 million for crime and licensing in Darlington

- 3. Crime




The Alcohol Harm Reduction Unit
