## MEDIUM TERM FINANCIAL PLAN BUDGET SAVINGS PROPOSALS

#### Introduction

 To advise Members of the decision of Cabinet in relation to a number of budget savings proposals from areas which fall within the remit of this Scrutiny Committee.

## **Background Information**

- 2. Cabinet, at its meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> April, 2013, considered a report of the Chief Officers Executive and agreed to a number of budget savings proposals which will deliver £2,252 million in 2013/14 and £3.337 million of savings, following full implementation.
- 3. This report was subsequently considered at a meeting of the Efficiency and Resources Scrutiny Committee following a request by its Members to scrutinise the potential risks and impacts associated with each of the savings proposals to ensure that Members fulfilled their corporate governance role and it agreed that the views of the Monitoring and Co-ordination Group should be sought on whether the proposals should be scrutinised by the relevant Scrutiny Committees.
- 4. The Monitoring and Co-ordination Group considered this at a special meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> April, 2013, and agreed that the report should be referred to Scrutiny Committees and that they should consider whether they wished to undertake any further work in relation to those proposals which fell within their individual remits.
- 5. The Cabinet report, together with the appendices which are relevant to this Scrutiny Committee are attached (Appendix 1) and, in considering whether to undertake any further work, Members need to be aware that the decision of Cabinet has been implemented and it is referred to Scrutiny for them to determine whether it wishes to undertake any further work at an early stage to identify any potential risks and impacts or, alternatively, defer consideration, to enable the full impact of the proposals to be assessed
