ADMISSIONS FOR THE RECEPTION CLASS AND YEAR 7 IN SEPTEMBER 2008

Purpose of Report

1. To inform Members of the numbers of applications made for school places for the 2008/09 year.

Information and Analysis

2. Secondary schools

Darlington's Scheme for Co-ordinated Admissions invites parents to make a preference for up to three secondary schools, ranking schools in order of preference, and stating reasons for their choice. It is the Council's aim to comply with the highest ranked preference indicated by parents.

- 3. Any parent who is not successful in gaining a school place can exercise a Right of Appeal to an Independent Appeal Committee. It is only when all appeals have been heard that a final picture can be drawn up of Year & allocations for 2008. (If a parent is successful in their appeal, their child moving to the roll of another school creates a vacancy, allowing another parent to move their child to a higher preferenced school).
- 4. At the time of writing, the situation for secondary schools is shown in Table 1 below:

5. Primary Schools

Parents can express a preference for up to five primary or infant schools. As with secondary schools, it is not possible to give absolute figures until appeals have been determined. The current situation for Primary and Infant schools is shown overleaf:

6. Appeals

At the time of writing, 20 families have lodged appeals in respect of secondary places at Community schools. This figure does not include appeals that have been made for places at Hurworth, Carmel or Eastbourne CofE Academy, as the Governors of these schools are the Admissions Authorities for the schools.

So far, two appeals have been received in respect of Primary places but parents still have time to register their intention to appeal against decisions relating to primary schools.

7. Inward Migration

Inward migration is still a trend in Darlington. In the six months since September 2007 there has been an increase of 102 secondary pupils and 190 primary pupils.

8. Officers are continuing to revise the Primary And Secondary Capital Strategies in light of increased pressure of pupil numbers.

Legal Implications

Impact on Looked After Children

11. Looked After Children are given first priority when applications for school places are being considered. Looked After Children in Darlington have received their first preferences, without recourse to appeal.
