CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE SCRUTINY COMMITTEE PERFORMANCE REPORT 3RD QUARTER 2008/09

Purpose of Report

- 1. For members of the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee to:
 - (a) scrutinise the four service plans for which this Committee is responsible for monitoring, i.e. Children & Families, Partnerships, Planning & Resources and School Improvement, and;
 - (b) scrutinise those elements of the Sustainable Community Strategy, One Darlington: Perfectly Placed and Local Area Agreement for which the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee have responsibility for.

Summary

- 2. This report is the first in a refreshed approach to reporting performance to Scrutiny. This includes dedicated monitoring of those indicators contained within the Sustainable Community Strategy and Local Area Agreement that are relevant to this Committee.
- 3. The overall aggregated target for the four service plans is being achieved; however for just over a third of indicators (36%) no data is available for reporting. This is due to many indicators only reporting annually.
- 4. There are 29 indicators showing below target performance: seven in Children & Families, five in Partnerships, two in Planning & Resources and 15 in School Improvement. The 29 indictors includes six measuring Key Stage 3 performance that have been deleted by Government but which are included in this report because data is available for Darlington. In Children & Families some of the indicators have a low number of cases so that just one or two cases can mean that the target is missed. The below target indicators relate to youth justice and care assessments. For Partnerships, the indicators relate to adult learners in targeted wards, schools reaching nationally health schools status, extended schools and 16 to 18 years not in employment, education and training (NEET). In terms of the Planning and Resources service plan the indicators concern schools' satisfaction with home to school transport and schools with excess places. For School Improvement the indicators measure excluded pupils receiving alternative provision, permanent exclusions, attainment and progression and the achievement gap between those pupils with disadvantaged circumstances and their peers. More detail of specific indicators and the reasons for these areas of underperformance and how the impact on the service plan performance status is detailed in the main report.
- 5. Data is also presented for this committee's scrutiny responsibilities as regard the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS) and Local Area Agreement (LAA). For the SCS,

data is available for two of four indicators. One target is not being achieved, that for the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4. As regards the LAA there are 22 applicable indicators (including those Key Stage 3 deleted from the NIS but included here) of which data is available for 18 with seven showing under target performance, primarily to do with education achievement and progression.

6. Finally, those national indicators aligned to the Children & Young People Scrutiny Committee are presented, with any areas of underperformance highlighted.

Recommendations

7. Members are asked to:

- (a) consider performance against the service plans and use this to inform their scrutiny of services;
- (b) set up task and finish groups as necessary to scrutinise performance in identified services and/or for individual performance indicators as decided;
- (c) consider performance against the Sustainable Community Strategy and Local Area Agreement for those indicators which the Committee is responsible for scrutinising and note the overall performance, with reasons for under performance detailed in **Appendix 1,** and ;
- (d) note the performance of all national indicators linked to all scrutiny committees where data is available, as outlined in **Appendix 2.**





MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

- 8. For 2008/09 the service plans that this committee have responsibility for monitoring are Children & Families, Partnerships, Planning & Resources and School Improvement.
- 9. Overall, aggregated performance of the four service plans is on target as are the individual service plans.





10. A number of NIs relating to assessment at Key Stage 3 have been deleted by Government and these are still included in this report. It should be noted that at this stage of reporting at quarter three, there is no available data for 36% of indicators, due to annual collection.

Trend information

11. Performance against target and trend is summarised in the following table. The trend column shows the trend from the same quarter in the previous year and should be treated with caution as this is the first year of the NIS and not all indicators have trend data.

Areas of underperformance

12. There are a total of 29 indicators currently below target, reasons for which are detailed in **Appendix 2**.

- 13. This report gives a high level overview of performance against relevant indicators contained within the Sustainable Community Strategy. Of 15 high level indicators contained within the Strategy, four (one has two parts) are linked to Children & Young People Scrutiny.
- 14. Of the four indicators, two are currently reporting performance, with part of NI 102ii (achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school meals and their peers at Key Stage 4) below target as noted earlier in the report.

Local Area Agreement

15. Twelve indicators are reporting performance, with one showing under target performance. Reasons are outlined in **Appendix 1**.



National Indicator Set

16. There are currently 188 national indicators of which 74 are linked to the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee. It should be noted that a number of indicators have more than one part so the actual number is greater than 188. Overall across the entire basket of national indicators, performance is above target for those indicators reporting data. Of the 74 Children & Young People related National Indicators, analysis shows that 12 are below target, seven are above target and 27 are on target. There are 33 indicators that show no data currently, i.e.:
