Information and Analysis

- 4. The Government wishes to ensure that parents are treated fairly when they apply for a school place and that Admissions Authorities follow policies that are fair and reasonable. The Government has published a School Admissions Code that sets out clearly acceptable oversubscription criteria. The Code also provides advice on the co-ordinated admissions management system all Local Authorities must operate and highlights the need for cooperation between and amongst school admission authorities in the district.
- 5. The Local Admissions Forum must compile a report every year, for submission to the Schools Adjudicator. The Adjudicator can pass comment on the report and require admission authorities to review or amend their oversubscription criteria or practices, to bring them up to the nationally acceptable standard. The format of the report and the information to be contained within it is proscribed by the Adjudicator's office.
- 6. Last year, the Adjudicator recommended minor adjustments to the wording of oversubscription criteria for voluntary aided schools. These adjustments were readily accepted by the authorities concerned and have been put in place for the 2009/10 admission s round.
