
Draft Local Plan Governance Structure



Draft Governance Principles:

- Role To oversee and shape the local plan evidence base and inform options and choices.
 Individuals to act as feedback to groups they represent.
- 2. **Lead** By the council in collaboration with others.
- 3. <u>Membership</u> Representatives that can make the plan a reality including The Council, Developers, Infrastructure Providers, Agencies, Others?
- 4. Outcomes:
 - a. Develop a robust evidence base for the Local Plan that can be delivered.
 - b. Develop a detailed Master Plan Framework.

Draft Governance Principles

- Role To research, investigate and develop responses to Local Plan wide issues.
- 2. <u>Lead</u> Lead to be assigned appropriate to task/issue.
- 3. <u>Membership</u> Representatives of key stakeholders relevant to topic, technical experts, community or interest groups.

4. Outcomes:

- To develop a robust plan wide evidence base and responses to delivery in the wider plan context.
- b. To inform policy development.
- c. To inform the delivery of the plan making agenda at a site project level.

Draft Governance Principles

- Role To develop the evidence base to demonstrate the appropriate allocation of development sites and on the inclusion of policy that will guide future developments.
- 2. <u>Lead</u> Developers/Landowners
- Membership Developers,
 Landowners, infrastructure
 providers, 'gate keepers' including
 local communities.

4. Outcomes:

- a. Evidence base to answer ATLAS '7 Questions'.
- b. Successful allocation of sites within the local plan.
- c. Informing the place making agenda at Local Plan scale.
- d. Concept plans for strategic development.
