LIBRARY POSITION STATEMENT

Purpose of Report

1. To seek Members' endorsement for the Library Position Statement.

Information and Analysis

- 2. Following the announcement of the 2002 Annual Library Plan assessments, such plans were discontinued as part of the Local Government White Paper implementation process. The plans were succeeded by Library Position Statements.
- 3. The Library Position Statement shows how the Local Authority intends to shape and deliver the library services in line with the themes in *Framework for the Future*, and is intended to give an indication of current levels of service.
- 4. All authorities have also been required to submit information about their achievement of the public library standards as at March 31st 2004, and to provide information about these achievements in the Position Statement.
- 5. The Position Statement is a requirement of the Department of Culture, Media and Sport and is a statutory document
- 6. In line with the assessment of last years Position Statement and the current guidelines, the information is mostly presented in tables and bullet points, rather than in narrative form.

Outcome of Consultation

7. No consultation has been undertaken in producing this position statement.

Legal Implications

8. This report has been considered by the Borough Solicitor for legal implications in accordance with the Council's approved procedures. There are no issues which the Borough Solicitor considers need to be brought to the specific attention of Members, other than those highlighted in the report.
