SUMMARY OF SURVEY AND ALL SURVEY ANSWERS

Summary of Responses

In total 46 responses were returned, there was only one ward with no responses.

44.4% (20) of respondents are employed and of these 15 are employed full time

10 respondents are members of cabinet

73.3% of respondents are a member of scrutiny, the largest percentage of which spend between 6 and 10 hours per month working on their portfolio

Where respondents are a member of another Council Committee or Panel the largest percentage spend between 0 to 5 hours and 6 to 10 hours per month working on their role per month 33.3% of respondents also have a specific role within their group with the largest percentage spending 3 to 4 and 5 to 6 hours per month on their role

10 respondents reported having difficulty recruiting candidates to stand for election

80% of respondents are representatives on other bodies, the largest percentage of which spend more than 10 hours per month on their role

97.8% of respondents hold a word surgery the most being monthly (27) however 15 reported holding 2 per month

42.2% of respondents spend over 20 hours per month on ward work, including meetings, home visits and telephone calls

93.3% produce a ward newsletter, 65.9% of which are quarterly; the majority of respondents do not use social media in their Councillor role.

10 respondents reported spending more than 20 hours per month on communications in their Councillor role, the largest percentage being 0-5 hours

46.7% of respondents spend between 3 & 4 hours per month on training and development, 34 respondents spend time mentoring and supporting other Councillors.

An analysis has been carried out of the headline findings from the LGG National Census of Local Authority Councillors 2010 and results compared to our Member Survey 2012.

Nationally Councillor who responded to the survey spend on average 23 hour per week on their role in Darlington the average is 20 hours per week

Nationally 45.1% of Councillors responding report being employed full time, part time or self employed compared to 44.4% of Darlington respondents. However, nationally 20.1% of Councillors who responded to the survey were employed full time compared to 34% in Darlington.

Nationally 8% of Councillors who responded to the survey use Facebook or Twitter compared to 17% of Darlington Councillors who have a Councillor Twitter account and 19.5 who have a Councillor Facebook account.


32. On average per month how many hours do you spend making and receiving phone calls?




33. Thinking about everything above how many hours a month do you spend on Ward work?

I spend a great deal of time visiting schools, nurseries, Children's Centres and trying to speak with and learn from the experiences of children, young people and their families. Much of this is structured, but a lot of it is not. It is extremely difficult to quantify the amount of time spent on Council related business as I am a well-known figure in the local community and find that every trip out to the supermarket, park, etc. contains some contact and discussion with members of the public and inevitably some follow-up work to be done. I do it because I love it and I feel that I make a positive difference. I am in a happy position of not having to count my pennies. I fear, however, that some people with skills and talents that could be used for the benefit of the community are put off becoming councillors by the workload and the lack of support and remuneration for their commitment.

I write numerous letters and interview residents

This questionnaire totally misunderstands what being a councillor is about. And was written by someone who has obviously never been a councillor. It is also to some extend nosey. Especially the questions about recruitment and party membership. It will be interesting to see how these answers are used. I see the whole design of these questions as amateurish and unprofessional. Writing in this tiny little box is not much fun. And how do you know this is me and not somebody else? I could be anybody this form has no security, no logon, no credibility.

Most time spent is related to support of and communication with ward organisations, residents association, community partnership (secretary), Community First panel (Chair)

See answer to Q11, As Chair of a Scrutiny Committee, briefings with Officers, at least 1 hour per day on e.mails etc.

The role of councillor is quite diverse and sometime more time is given from one month to another, specifically if arrangements have been made to sit on a tribunal and it is cancelled. Licencing sub committees can vary also from month to month and can vary in hours sitting.

I check email every day addressed to my Councillor account and tend to use this as a form of communication with Officers and colleagues rather than phone unless it is an urgent enquiry. approx 11 hours per month.

My colleague and I deliver our newsletters to every house ourselves. This takes 17 man hours but leads to excellent interaction with ward residents.

This questionnaire does not reflect the role of a councillor the question asked do not allow for true reflection of work undertaken by a councillor

I am Chairperson of Salters Community Garden Project. This is not as a Council Representative but arose out Ward work, this involves at least 4-5 hours per month. Also PACT meetings and now Environmental Visual Audits with PACT members another 4 - 5 hours. Parish Council attendance can take up to 2/3 hours guarterly

Ward Newsletters are delivered to residents five times per year and are delivered personally by myself

Most constituents are now on email and I spend many hours dealing with email correspondence... I produce a twelve page village newsletter, this includes looking for local companies to include adverts - these adverts pay for the printing of the village newletter - this is then delivered to two thousand homes and farms around MSG.(I have a team who help with the delivery.) I organise the annual village Christmas tree and the lighting up celebration, also the carol concert, booking and organising the brass band, and the Christmas Fayre. This year along with my colleague Cllr York we have tendered for, and project managed, the village sports pitch and the refurbishment of the youth club using developers 106 monies (this took many hours of meetings and consulting with residents and builders.) I attend Low Dinsdale parish council. I do all of the above as the ward councillor

No

I do not need to hold Street Surgeries - I try to ensure that people know where I live & they have my contact details. People who need to see me will stop me in the street in the pub on High Row etc. As an elected Councillor I do believe in making myself available at all times to all people so that should anyone have cause to worry over a problem they know they can contact me as shown by a telephone call at 1.35 in the morning and 6.25am when on two occasions an elderly woman could not sleep because she was anxious over a specific problem which she felt could not wait until later.

I have been involved with Firth Moor Community Centre for over 30YRS and I do over 6 hours a day as a voluntary work.

Cockerton West ward work is very varied, from the obvious grass cutting issues - to homelessness. It is one of the most deprived wards in the Borough and the needs of resident's go beyond some of the other wards. Some of my resident's just need some reassurance when they phone to know someone is there for them, and a conversation is all that is needed on occasion. With the Welfare Reform's being introduced some are very worried. I enjoy immensely taking time to go into the two residential homes for the older of the community, I tend to go for the coffee morning and chat to the residents.

I have found Family live has a strain, unless you have a strong relationship and you don't mind missing family events being a councillor is not a bad life.

As a councillor the time I spend on ward matters is dictated by my constituents because I'm am always accessible

Not only do I mentor Councillors in my group I mentor potential candidates and this takes up more time the closer I get to elections.

I attend events related to my portfolio e.g. Age UK, GOLD, Tenants Board and officer briefings
