Purpose of Report

1. To inform Council of the Delivery and Improvement Statement (DIS) submitted to the Commission for Social Care Inspection (CSCI) on 31 May 2006. This DIS is attached at **Appendix 1**.

Background

2. Adult Social Services are required to submit a Delivery and Improvement Statement (DIS) to CSCI twice yearly (May and November), setting out performance projections against national and local performance indicators. The DIS is used by CSCI to make judgements about Adult Social Services' knowledge of its strengths and areas for improvement. It also forms part of the evidence used by CSCI to make the star ratings judgement. It is a requirement of CSCI that the DIS submission is reported to an open session of the Council members within two months of it being submitted to CSCI on 31 May 2006.

Outcome of Consultation

3. No consultation was required to produce this report.

Legal Implications

4. This report has been considered by the Legal Services Manager for legal implications in accordance with the Council's approved procedures. There are no issues which the Legal Services Manager considers need to be brought to the specific attention of Members, other than those highlighted in the report.
