PROPOSED PROTOCOL FOR MEMBERS ON GIFTS AND HOSPITALITY

Purpose of Report

1. To consider the adoption of a protocol for Members on gifts and hospitality.

Background

- 2. A report was presented **(attached as an appendix)** to the Standards Committee of the Council on 11th April, 2005 on a proposed protocol for Members on gifts and hospitality.
- 3. The Committee approved the draft protocol submitted, requesting officers to consider online registration facilities for Members and also to bring the matter specifically to the attention of Parish Councils within the Borough Council area for their consideration.
- 4. A letter has been sent to the Clerk to each ParishCouncil, inviting them to bring the matter to the attention of their Council.
- 5. The Council is now asked to consider the draft protocol with a view to adoption, as supported by the Standards Committee.

Outcome of Consultation

6. This report has not been the subject of formal consultation. A copy has nevertheless been sent to all Parish Councils in the Borough Council area with the agenda for the Standards Committee of 11th April, 2005 (in accordance with normal practice), and their attention will be specifically directed to this matter by the Monitoring Officer at the request of the Standards Committee.

Legal Implications

7. This report has been considered by the Borough Solicitor for legal implications in accordance with the Council's approved procedures. There are no issues which the Borough Solicitor considers need to be brought to the specific attention of Members, other than those highlighted in the report.

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
