SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To seek Members' agreement to release capital funds awarded from the Football Foundation for the Longfield School – Sports Project.

Summary

- 2. Longfield School were successful in securing a grant allocation from the DCSF as it was then, through the Youth Sports Trust to develop a 3rd Generation Synthetic Turf Pitch (STP), to compliment and enhance the sporting facilities already available at the school.
- 3. In addition to £530,000 already released from Cabinet (28th July 2010), this paper seeks approval to release a further £52,679 which has been awarded from the Football Foundation to support the project.

Recommendation

4. It is recommended that Members agree to formally release the capital funding of £52,679;

 - (a) Detailed planning to target need has been undertaken which ensures effective use of investment.

MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

- 6. Longfield School is a Sports College: this designation requires the School to develop and maintain good links with local sports clubs as well as to promote access to its facilities by the local community for active recreation. Longfield already has good links with its partner schools, with local sports clubs and community users of its facilities.
- 7. In July 2010, Cabinet released £530,000 funding received from the Department for Education for the development of a Synthetic Turf Pitch at the school. The project is to assist the delivery of curricular PE and school sport, and will also better accommodate community access, particularly during the evenings, weekends and holidays when the synthetic pitch will be made available for managed community use.
- 8. In addition to the initial grant funding received, the Council also submitted a bid to the Football Foundation. The grant letter, confirming success of this bid, was received on 16th November 2010.
- 9. The allocation of £52,679 will be used to address Planning Conditions imposed on the project and provide additional equipment at the facility for the school and community users.
- 10. A formal planning application for the full-sized fenced and floodlit synthetic turf pitch along with temporary access and car parking was approved on Wednesday 25th August 2010 and work started on site Monday 13th September 2010.
- 11. Members are asked to approve the release of the additional funding received in November to enable the final aspects of the project to be fully completed.
