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SECONDARY SCHOOLS BUILDING SCHOOLS FOR THE FUTURE

SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To advise Members of the Expression of Interest sent to the Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) and Partnerships for Schools, seeking to have Darlington included in the next wave of funding available under the Building Schools for the Future (BSF) programme.

Summary

2. Darlington is not scheduled to be included in the BSF programme until 2013-14. Given the Authority's established track-record in handling capital projects relating to schools, an Expression of Interest has been submitted to DCSF requesting acceleration through the programme. This would mean work could start on refurbishing the three secondary schools in the Borough that have not been modernised, and improving the use of ICT as a learning medium in all secondary schools.

Recommendations

- 3. It is recommended that Members:-
 - (a) receive the report for information; and
 - (b) request the Director of Children's Services to bring further reports on the outcome of presenting the Expression of Interest.

MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

- 4. Darlington has a good record of attracting capital funds to the Borough and four of its seven secondary schools have been replaced or refurbished in the last five years. Haughton School is integrated into The Education Village; Carmel RC College has recently had building work completed; and work on Hummersknott School is well advanced. The former Eastbourne School closed, and a new building for Eastbourne Church of England Academy is currently under construction at Hundens Lane, and is due to open for students in September 2009.
- 5. Three schools, Longfield, Hurworth and Branksome are housed in buildings dating from the 1960s and they do not currently provide the learning environment and opportunities described in our Children's Plan. Demographic projections indicate that it will be necessary to maintain seven secondary schools in Darlington. The spread of the population further

indicates that the locations of the current school buildings serve the population well.

- 6. The BSF programme presents the opportunity to look critically and creatively at school improvement. Through the strategy of schools@onedarlington we seek to ensure that all schools in the secondary phase can co-operate, share expertise and embrace the 14-19 agenda, providing all pupils with the best possible opportunities for achievement and personalised learning. Investment in Information and Communications Technology is key to turning aspirations for transformational teaching and learning into reality.
- 7. Our Expression of Interest records that we have only three schools requiring refurbishment, that we are well prepared to develop advances in transformational learning, with schools 'signed up' to co-operative working, and that we are confident of our readiness to deliver, should funding be made available to Darlington from April 2009.
- 8. A copy of the Expression of Interest is attached to this report as **Appendix A.**

Conclusion

9. Moving forward in the BSF programme would assist in the drive to improve standards across Darlington's secondary schools, and increase the opportunities available to pupils in the new 14-19 agenda.
