SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To consider the establishment of a Panel of Members for the appointment of a person to fill the vacancy of Community Representative on the Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee.

Summary

2. The Scrutiny Committee currently has a vacancy for a co-opted Member for a Community Representative following the resignation of Mr. Bob Egan in April, 2013.
3. There are two places for Community Representatives on the Scrutiny Committee and the other place is filled by Mr. D. Moyes.
4. Following the receipt of five applications to become a Community Representative it is suggested that a Panel of three Members of the Scrutiny Committee be established to consider these applications and agree an appointment.
