### SUMMARY REPORT

# **Purpose of the Report**

1. To consider a recommendation from the Standards Committee that mandatory training on public health responsibilities be introduced for all Councillors.

## **Summary**

- 2. The Standards Committee, at its meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2012, when considering a report of the Director of Public Health in relation to the public health transition and the future role and responsibilities of local authorities, agreed to recommend to Council that training in relation to this should be mandatory for all Councillors on a one-off basis in advance of April, 2013.
- 3. It is considered that this training is necessary to ensure that Members have an understanding of the new responsibilities and the implications of these and to ensure that the Authority is prepared for its new responsibilities.

#### Recommendation

4. Members are asked to approve the recommendation of the Standards Committee that mandatory training on public health responsibilities be introduced for all Councillors on a one-off basis in advance of April 2013, in preparation for public health transition.

## Information

- 6. The Standards Committee, at its meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2012, considered a report of the Director of Public Health in relation to the to the public health transition and the future role and responsibilities of local authorities and recommended that mandatory training in relation to this be undertaken by all Members of the Council in advance of April 2013.
- 7. The training will be in two stages, the first session, which will be undertaken prior to the end of January 2013 will cover :-
  - an overview of NHS Reforms and the implications for local authorities;
  - ensure that all Members are aware of the new responsibilities across the local authority (People, Place and Resources);
  - outline the implications of the new public health responsibilities across the local authority (People, Place and Resources);
  - concepts of prioritising in public health; and
  - an opportunity for Members to ask questions of public health specialists on the changes and what they mean.

- A training session which covered the elements of the first session has already been held on the 10th October, 2012, and Members who attended this session will not be required to attend this again. A subsequent date for this first session has been arranged for the 9<sup>th</sup> January, 2013
- 9. The second session, which has been arranged for the 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2013, will be a discursive session to engage Members in exploring the opportunities that public health transition brings and consider how to influence and shape the agenda, working together to improve public health.
