1. People in Darlington are healthy and supported.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Healthy Life Expectancy - Definition still to be confirmed but will measure years of life spent in self-reported good health. <i>Source Public Health Outcomes Framework 2012.</i> • Differences in life expectancy and healthy life expectancy between - Definition still to be confirmed but will measure inequalities in life expectancy and healthy life expectancy by area deprivation (both between LAs and within LAs). <i>Source Public Health Outcomes Framework 2012.</i> • Mortality from causes considered preventable - Definition still to be confirmed but will measure deaths that are caused through individual behaviours or public health measures limiting individual exposure to harmful substances and conditions e.g. lung cancer, drug use disorders, accidents etc. <i>Source Public Health Outcomes Framework 2012.</i> • Self-reported well-being - Definition uses the Warwick Edinburgh Mental Health Well-being score for adults age 16+. From 2013 the new national well-being indicator being developed by ONS will be used. <i>Source Public Health Outcomes Framework 2012.</i> • Self-reported experience of social care users - (control, dignity, personal care, food and nutrition, safety, social participation and accommodation) • No of referrals of Children in Need per 10,000 population under 18
