# PRIMARY CAPITAL PROGRAMME PROGRESS OF WORK

#### **SUMMARY REPORT**

# **Purpose of the Report**

1. The purpose of the report is to inform Members of the progress of work under the Primary Capital Programme (PCP).

# **Summary**

- 2. In previous reports to this Committee and to Cabinet, Members have received information about the capital funding received through the PCP. The funding has enabled the re-build of North Road Primary School and substantial refurbishments and re-modelling of 16 other schools in Darlington.
- 3. The summer holiday period is a convenient period to carry out building work, as contractors can have access to school buildings without disrupting pupil learning. This report provides a brief update on progress and future work to be undertaken.

# **Information and Analysis**

5. A brief description of the work undertaken at each school is included in the table below:

SCHOOL	COMMENT
North Road	The building work on the new school is progressing well and the
(Northwood	project is on schedule. It is anticipated that pupils will move to the
Primary)	new building from the start of the January Term, 2010. It is likely
	that when the second stage of the project begins (the demolition of
	the old building and returning the footprint for playing field) there
	may be some contaminated soil to manage. This is to be contained
	with in the client contingence sum.
Corporation Road	The plans include the demolition of the current inadequate dining
	room and kitchen and their replacement with a multi-purpose hall
	and kitchen. Improvements are also planned to the Foundation Stage
	accommodation and the external environment of the school. The
	multi-purpose hall is in the design stage. Demolition of the old
	dining hall will take place in December. The school have been in
	liaison with Community Services over temporary arrangements for
	the provision of school meals, which will be served in the old Junior
Alderman Leach	hall.
Alderman Leach	A four classroom extension is required to meet demand for pupil
	places. (Temporary classrooms were sited at the school in September 2008). Design work is complete and the contractors are
	on site. It is anticipated that the work will be completed by February
	half-term 2010.
Reid Street	The school is on a tight, land-locked site so improvement works
	present great difficulties for the management of pupils. Work is
	therefore scheduled to take place in holiday periods over 2009 and
	2010. Contractors are on site and work is progressing on re-
	modelling of pupil toilets and re-siting the entrance and reception
	areas
Gurney Pease	During the summer period the heating system is being replaced, the
	second phase of window replacement is being carried out and roof
	replacement will take place. Further work yet to be programmed
	includes and repairs and extensions to the security fencing and
	improvement and re-modelling of the school entrance.
Harrowgate Hill	Plans include the provision of extra classrooms space and the
	extension of some administrative and office space at the school.
	Major works are scheduled for the next financial year. Further
	investigation of demographic trends and planning permissions for
	new houses are being investigated before design work for the project
Red Hall	proceeds further.  The planned work includes replacement of the heating system (this
кси пан	will be carried out over three phases) and replacement of the flat roof
	with a pitched roof. Phase 1 of the heating system replacement is
	taking place during the summer break, 2009.
Whinfield	Preliminary work for the installation of additional ICT at the school
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	exposed problems with the electricity supply and wiring, which
	require urgent attention. The work will be carried out over the
	summer holiday period. Work on kitchen improvements and the
	replacement of a mobile classroom will not commence until the
	electrical distribution system is sound.
Heathfield	The school, along with Dodmire, Hurworth Primary and Borough
	road Nursery School attracted additional capital funding through a
	successful Co-Location bid. Further investigation is being carried out on demographic factors and the granting of planning permission for
	additional homes before any classroom extension work is
	undertaken. Work is to include refurbishment of the library. 'Epic
	classroom' to be built and large parts of the school remodelled to
	address long term suitability issues at Heathfield.
Hurworth	As above, Co-Location funding resources will augment the funding
	available to re-model the current Infant building at Hurworth so that
	the whole school can be re-sited in that building. Design work is
	underway and the project will be carried out in 2010.
Dodmire	As above Co-Location funding resources augment the funding
	available to re-model the school and assist with bringing together the
	former Infant and Junior buildings. Design work is underway and the
	project will be carried out in 2010.
Mount Pleasant	Internal re-modelling and refurbishment is scheduled to take place in
1viount i reasunt	2010.
Heighington	Internal refurbishment and re-modelling is scheduled to take place in
	2010.
High Conniscliffe	The external canopy outside the Infant class has been completed.
	Work on the turning circle and car park has been delayed and is
	subject to planning consent.
Abbey Federation	The new canopy and the new classroom have been completed. Work
	on the staffroom is taking place at the time of writing. Work is likely
	to continue into September 2009 on the Junior children's kitchen.

6. Although not part of the PCP, work is also well advanced at Borough Road Nursery School. Refurbishments are being made to the building and an extension is being provided so that the Kids & Co childcare facility currently located in the Town Hall can re-locate to Borough Road, where many of the children already receive their nursery entitlement.
