
2013-14 SCHOOL ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS

SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To seek Members' approval for the Local Authority's admission policy for the 2013/14 academic year and the co-ordinated arrangements for all schools in the Borough.

Summary

2. The School Admissions Code has been revised and comes into effect from 1 February 2012. Any amendments in line with the New Code have been drafted into these proposals. The Code states that the Local Authority is required to annually review the admission criteria used to allocate places for maintained primary and secondary schools in Darlington (ie schools which have not converted to Academy Status or Academies which may have not carried out consultation on their own 2013/14 admission policy).
3. Darlington Borough Council has consulted on reducing Home to School transport provision to the statutory minimum and as part of the MTFP which was agreed at Cabinet on 22 February 2012.
4. An outcome of this decision, that the Co-ordinated Admission Schemes for the over subscription criteria, has been consulted upon and is attached in **Appendix A:-**

Appendix A(i) details the Co-ordinated Admission Schemes for secondary applications to be considered for the 2013/14 academic year.

Appendix A(ii) details the Co-ordinated Admission Schemes for primary applications to be considered for the 2013/14 academic year.

5. Consultation has been undertaken in line with the Code. Details of the consultation undertaken are included in this report and any comments received are attached at **Appendix B.**
6. Once approved, there is a statutory duty on the Local Authority to forward the Co-ordinated Admissions Schemes to the Department of Education (DfE) before 15th April 2012.

Recommendation

7 It is recommended that members approve as attached at Appendix A the Primary and Secondary admissions policy and oversubscription criteria for 2013/14

Reasons

8 The recommendation is supported by the following reasons:-

- (a) The Authority is under a statutory duty to consult and adopt an admission scheme for both Primary and Secondary school places for the academic year 2013/14.
- (b) If the scheme is not approved and returned to the DfE by the 15th April 2012 the Secretary of State may impose a scheme on the Authority.

S17 Crime and Disorder	Not relevant to this report
Health and Well Being	Offering a school place to meet parental preference and close to a child's address enhances safeguarding and provides security for the child.
Sustainability	Darlington's communities are enhanced through the provision of school places to meet locality needs.
Diversity	There are a range of schools in Darlington with Governance ranging from Community Schools to Voluntary Aided, and Academy. Parents have a wide choice of schools to match the diverse needs of a pluralistic community.
Wards Affected	The admissions criteria affects children living in all wards across Darlington
Groups Affected	Parents, Pupils, Schools, Neighbouring Authorities, other Admission Authorities.

Efficiency	The Admissions Policy and management of school places ensures that the Local Authority complies with statutory guidance on Surplus Places. This enables parents to have a choice in a school place but ensures resources are not wasted and school budgets are not overcommitted.

MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

7. The Local Authority acts as a 'clearing house' for all applications for a place at a school in Darlington at the normal point of entry (September). This is part of a co-ordinated scheme where the Local Authority is the admissions authority for community and voluntary controlled schools and acts on behalf of the admission authority of voluntary aided schools, and Academies in the Borough. Co-ordination also includes the offering of places to children who are resident in Darlington but have stated a preference for a school in another LA area. The Authority will make a single offer of a school place each academic year, to parents who have expressed a preference for their child to be admitted to a maintained school within Darlington. Although all applications will be considered on an equal weighting basis, should a child be eligible for a place at more than one school, parents/carers are requested to rank their order of preference on the 'Primary/Secondary School Application Form 2013/14 in order that only one offer will be made. The relevant

admissions oversubscription criteria will be applied to all schools that are oversubscribed.

8. The equal preference system operates to give parents choice in their selection of schools, allocating their highest ranked preference wherever possible.
9. Attached at **Appendix A(i)** is the Co-ordinated Admission Scheme for secondary school applications if the home to school transport policy is to be changed and 'Associated Transport' no longer provided for secondary schools by this Authority.
Full details of this criterion are provided in **Appendix A(i)**
13. Attached at **Appendix A(ii)** is the Co-ordinated Admission Schemes for primary applications to be considered for the 2013/14 academic year, the primary criteria are not affected by the consultation.
Full details of this criterion are provided in **Appendix A(ii)**
14. Where a child has undergone statutory assessment and a statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN) has been issued, the statement will name the school the child should attend. All schools are obliged to admit the child in accordance with the statement.
15. Once approved, there is a statutory duty on the Local Authority to forward the Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme to the Department for Education (DfE) before 15th April 2012. If this does not happen the Secretary of State may impose a scheme on the Authority.

Outcome of Consultation

16. The Authority is legally obliged to consult with relevant admission authorities by 1st March in the year of entry. Consultation has taken place with all neighbouring authorities, admission authorities within the Borough, Headteachers and Governing Bodies, Local Admissions Forum and parents.
17. The Local Authority would have to respond where appropriate upon comments on its proposed co-ordinated scheme for 2013/14. Any comments are attached at **Appendix B**. None required a response from the Local Authority
