38. COUNCIL REPORTS – Further Electoral Review – Warding Arrangements - The Chief Executive submitted a report (previously circulated) to give consideration:

The Chief Executive submitted a report (previously circulated) to give consideration to a joint proposal from the Labour and Conservative Groups for the warding arrangements for Darlington, for submission to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE).

The submitted report stated that the Council had been given the opportunity to make a submission to the LGBCE on the future warding arrangements for Darlington. It was highlighted that, as part of the second stage of the review, the Labour and Conservative Groups had considered the warding arrangements for Darlington, and proposed a total of 22 wards, 4 rural wards and 18 urban wards, which contained between one and three councillors. The proposed submission was attached at Appendix 1 of the submitted report.
