MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

5. From May 2005 all applications for Community Grants are able to be considered and granted under delegated powers by the Member responsible for the Resources portfolio, however where that member has a an interest in the applicant those applications must be considered by Cabinet. An application has been received from Age Concern, Councillor Stephen Harker the Member holding the Resources Portfolio has a personal and prejudicial interest in this application and so a decision on this application should be made by Cabinet.

Age Concern

- 6. An application has been received from Age Concern Darlington for 20% Discretionary Rate Relief for their premises at Bradbury House, Beaumont Street, Darlington and 9 Clarks Yard, Darlington. Mandatory relief of 80% has already been granted for these properties.
- 7. Age Concern Darlington is a registered charity whose object is "to promote the relief of older people in any manner which is deemed to be charitable in and around the area of Darlington" this is achieved through a number of activities including the organisation of direct services to older people.
- 8. The main criteria for applications for Community Grant are that the aims of the group should be linked to one or more of the Community Strategy themes. Age Concern links with the Healthy Darlington theme of the Community Strategy by maximising people's ability to live independently throughout their lives and developing a plan for an ageing population.
