SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To report the final findings of the Alcohol Review Group established by the Health and Partnerships Scrutiny Committee to scrutinise the indicators relating to alcohol within the Health profile for Darlington and make appropriate recommendations to Cabinet.

Summary

- At a meeting of the Health and Partnerships Scrutiny Committee held on 29 October 2013 it was agreed to establish a Task and Finish Review Group and all Members of that Committee were invited to participate in the Review.
- 3. The Review Group has met on two occasions and a wide number of issues have been discussed and considered at those meetings.
- 4. Other methods of investigation included consideration of the Director of Public Health's report on Alcohol Related Harm, a visit to the Community Abstinence in Recovery Centre, information highlighted in the Access to GP Appointments Review Group, a presentation to Licensing Committee on the Alcohol Harm Reduction Unit and a presentation to GOLD Health Group on the unsafe consumption of alcohol and subsequent harmful effects on the elderly.
- 5. At its meeting held on 7 January the Health and Partnerships Scrutiny Committee approved the recommendations within the Final Report **(Appendix 1)** and forwarded those recommendations to Cabinet for consideration.
