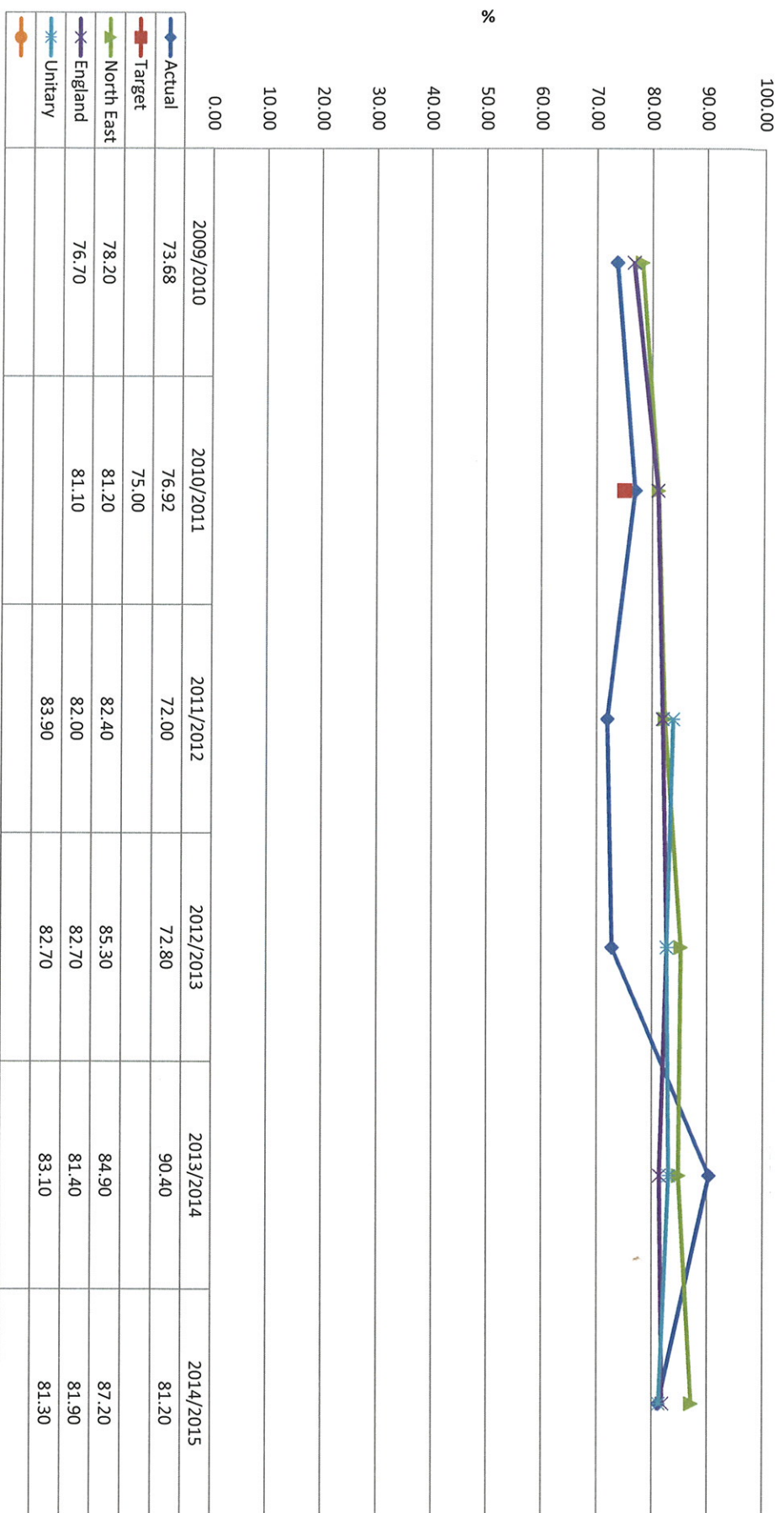
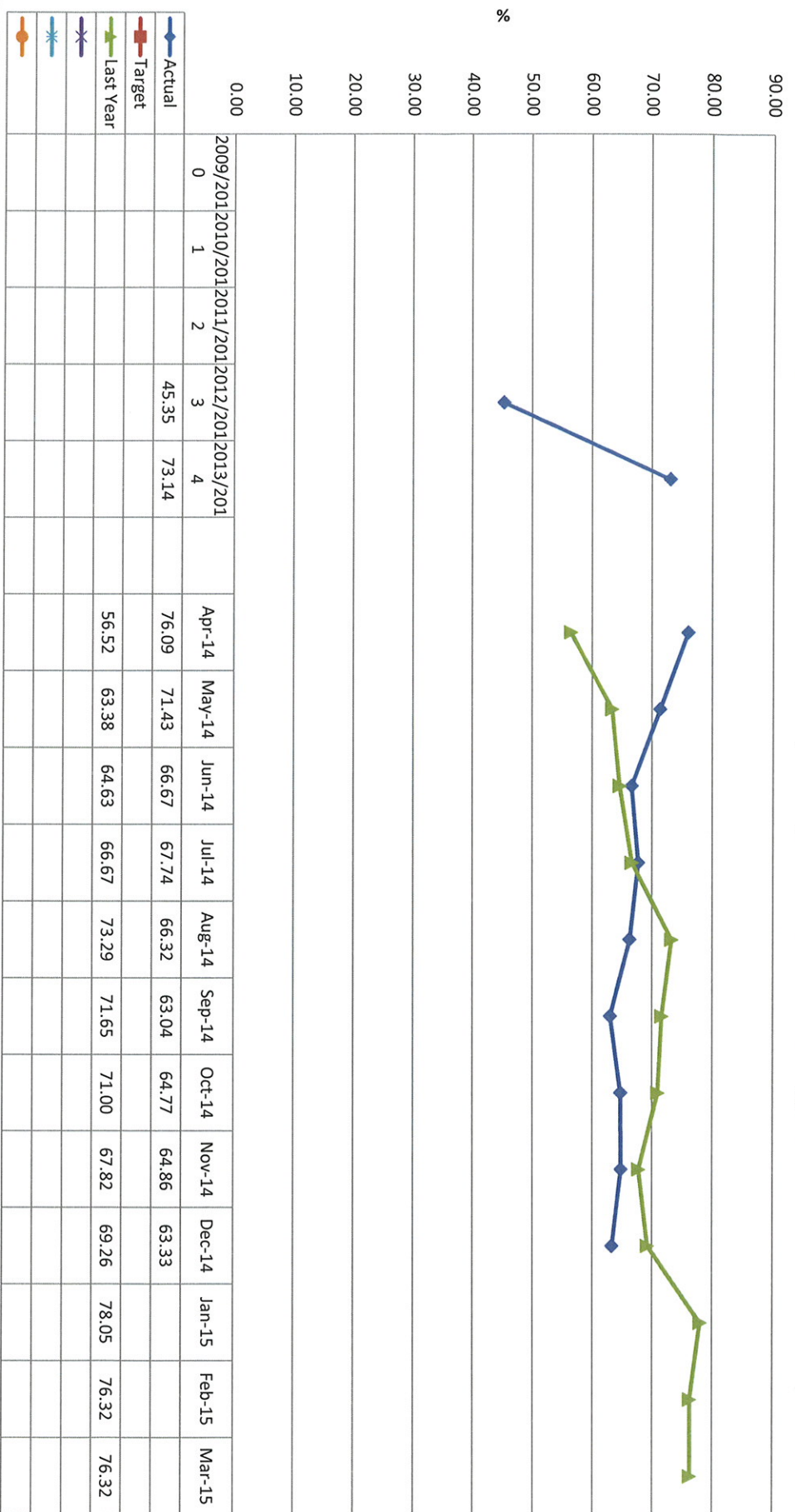

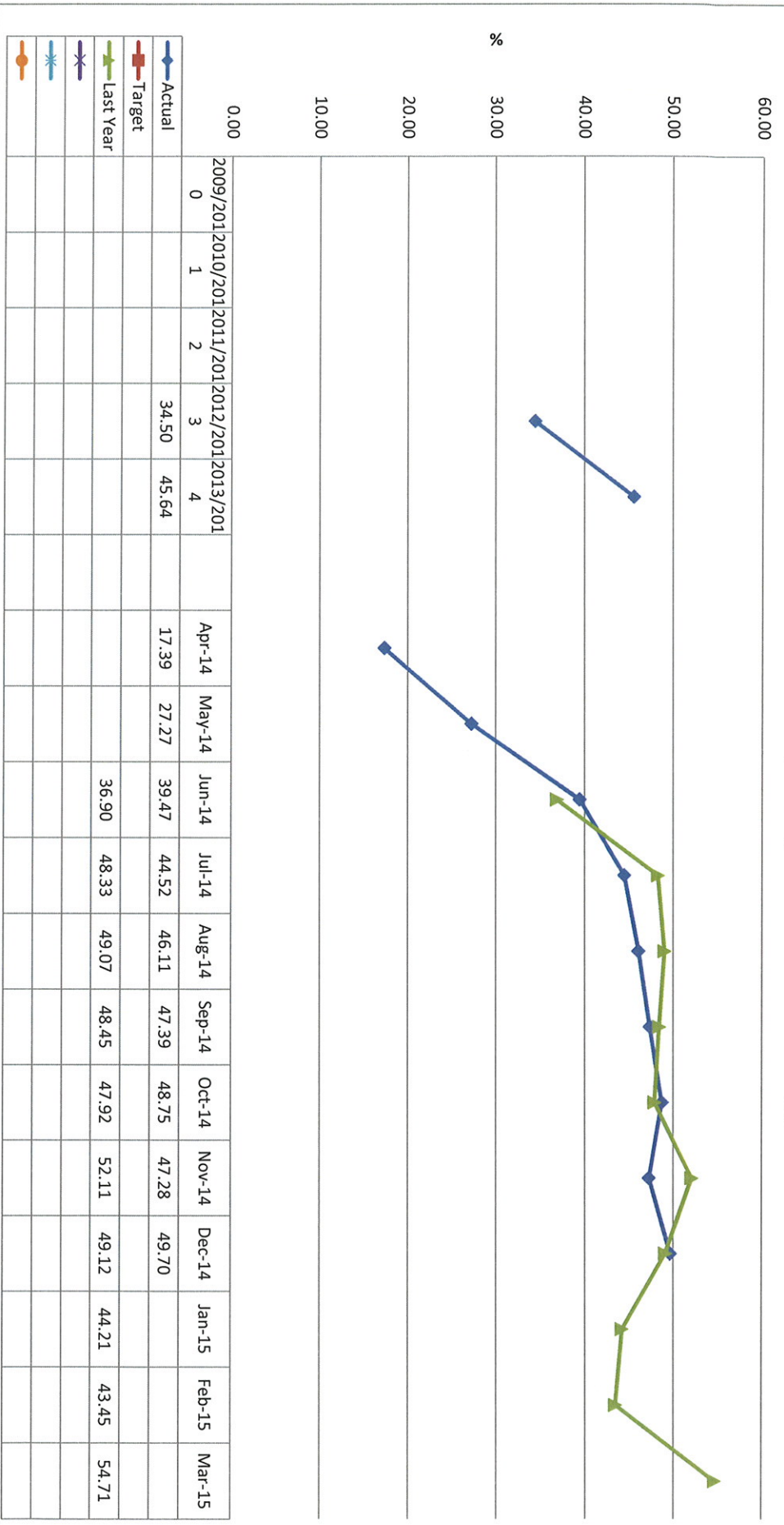
Qtr 2 - Increasingly complex cases being referred for re-ablement along with increased difficulty in accessing intermediate care beds.

LI 2049 Percentage of people who have no ongoing care needs following completion of provision of a reablement package. What's Best: Bigger



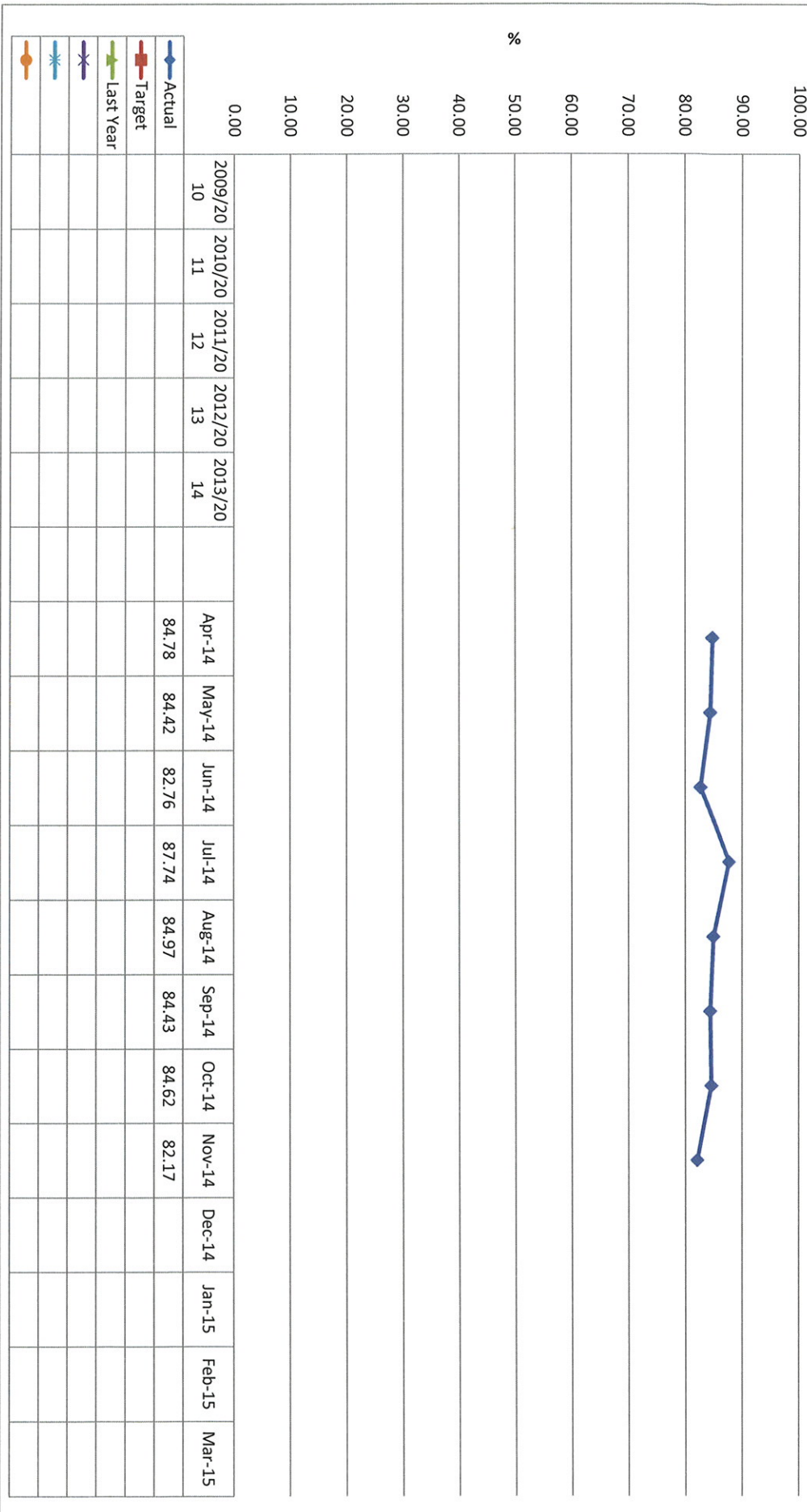

LI 2051 Percentage of people whose need for home care has reduced through provision of a reablement package. What's Best: Bigger



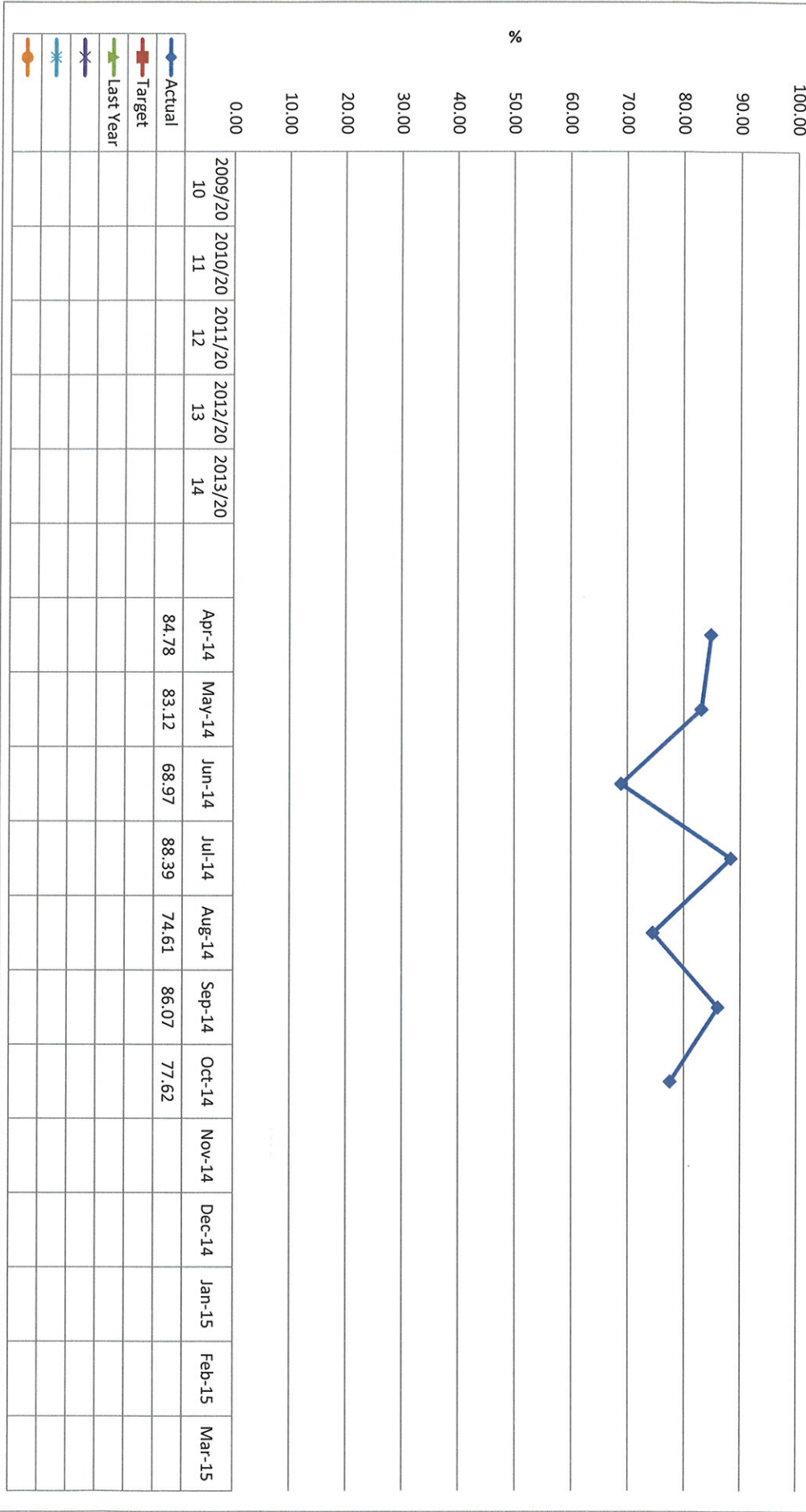
Qtr 2 - After a relatively poor start to the year performance is now on par with the same period last year. Data points for April and May are questionable and may be indicative of a reporting backlog.

XNEW 01 Still at home 30 days after RIACT What's Best: Bigger



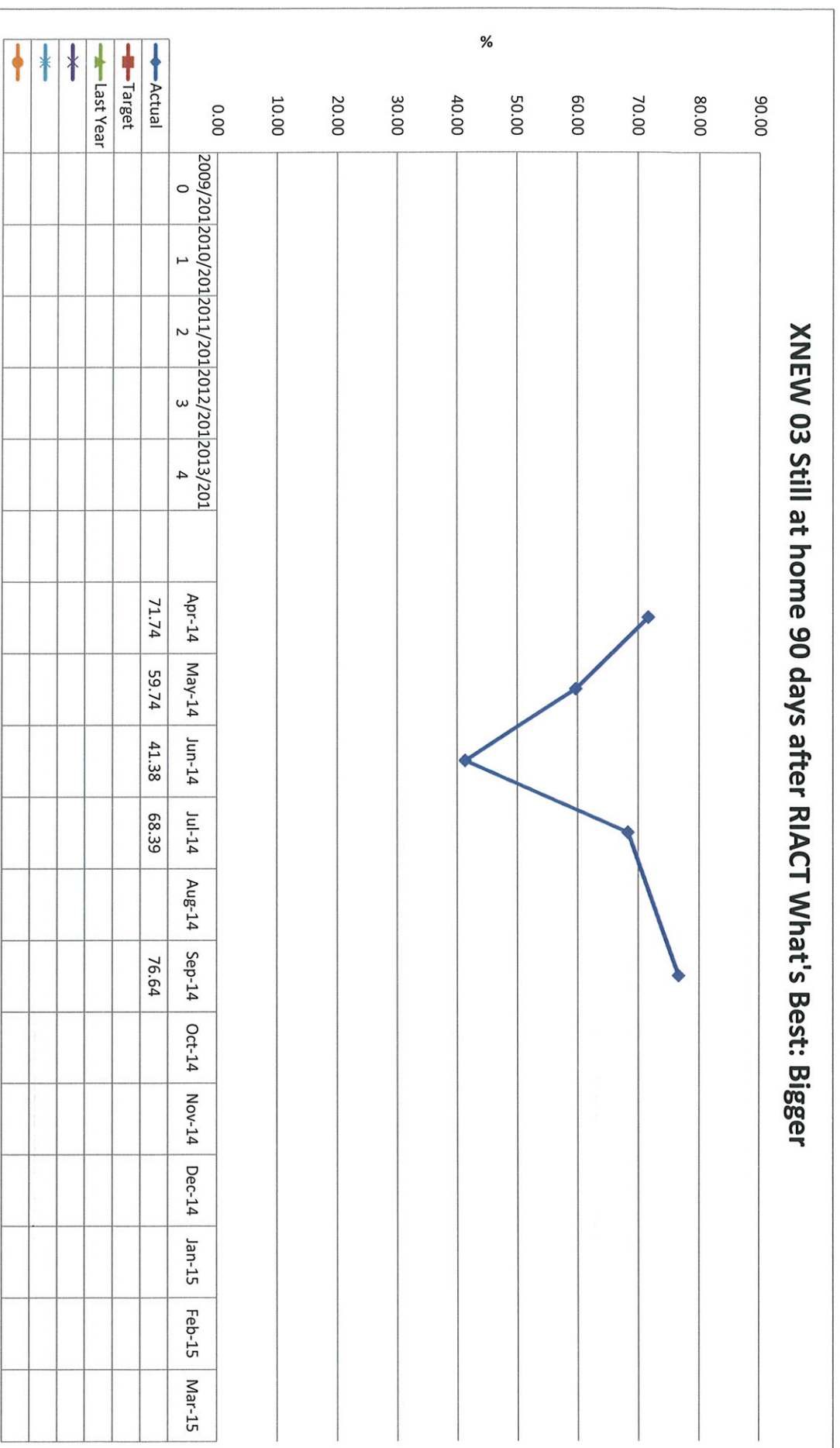
