MAIN REPORT

Background

- 7. In Darlington community safety is managed through the local Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership (CDRP). Although Darlington Borough Council is the accountable body for the Safer Communities funding, the use of these funding streams are agreed through the local CDRP reporting structures in the first instance.
- 8. The Council has received grant of £84,118 from the Home Office for safer community initiatives and £32,000 from Youth Crime Action Plan Funding.

Use of Funding

- 9. The CDRP Executive Board and CDRP Business Group agreed to purchase a highly visible mobile unit to provide a base for the deployment of resources at the heart of communities experiencing anti-social problems. Funding for this unit was agreed to come from Safer Stronger Communities funding of £42,059 and £32,000 from Youth Crime Action Plan Funding (Children's Services) as a revenue contribution from the revenue grant received.
- 10. This mobile unit is based in Community Services with annual running expenses coming from existing budgets within the Safer Communities team and Community Services.
- 11. The CDRP Executive Board has also agreed to utilise £42,059 of Safer Communities capital funding to fund projects on key priorities such as removal of graffiti (£20,000), security equipment (£9,500), and other measures including domestic abuse support.
- 12. Members are asked to release the capital allocation of £116,118 towards the cost of the mobile unit and priorities detailed in paragraph 11.

Outcome of Consultation
