AUDIT SERVICES – QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM SURVEILLANCE REPORT

Purpose of Report

1. To present the Quality Management System surveillance report.

Information and Analysis

- 2. Audit Services operate a management system certified to the ISO9001:2000 International Quality Standard which drives the Service's processes and operations. The system is accredited via Lloyds Quality Assurance Limited and is subject to an annual surveillance inspection and three yearly re-accreditation process to ensure the system's continued fitness for purpose and compliance against the International Standard.
- 3. **Attached** is a copy of the report produced by the external assessors following a surveillance visit in December 2007 to monitor the Services performance and compliance against the International Standard.
- 4. The assessment outcome from the visit is extremely positive. The report highlights that Audit Services continues to meet the requirements of the ISO 9001:2000 Standard by maintaining and improving it's management system and no specific issues were identified during the visit that would affect certification.
- 5. In addition the report states that there is evidence available through achievement of performance indicators to demonstrate that the system is used to deliver stakeholder requirements and customer satisfaction. Moreover, continual improvement as required under the standard was demonstrated through the use of electronic working papers, the move to a paperless environment and the re engineering of the Audit Risk Assessment methodology to provide a more comprehensive assessment of audit risk.

There are no issues which the Legal Services Manager considers need to be brought to the specific attention of Members, other than those highlighted in the report.
