Purpose of the Report

1. To consider the establishment of a Task and Finish Review Group to examine the arrangements in place to minimise youth offending.

Summary

2. At the meeting of the Monitoring and Co-ordination Group held on 2nd March, 2009 approval was given for the establishment of a Task and Finish Review by this Scrutiny Committee to examine specific issues relating to youth offending for which this committee has responsibility for monitoring performance indicators, namely-- NI 043 Young people within the Youth Justice System receiving a conviction in court who are sentenced to custody; NI 044 Ethnic composition of offenders on Youth Justice System disposals; NI 045 Young offenders engagement in suitable education, employment or training; NI 046 Young offenders access to suitable accommodation; NI 051 Effectiveness of child and adolescent mental health (CAMHS) services (relating specifically to young offenders or those at risk of offending); NI 111 First time entrants to the Youth Justice System aged 10-17; NI 115 Substance misuse by young people.

Recommendations

3. It is recommended that Members establish a Task and Finish Review Group, comprising all Members of this Scrutiny Committee to consider these aspects of youth offending.
