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CHILDRENS SERVICES EDUCATION PREMISES CAPITAL PROGRAMME – 2005-2006

Purpose of Report

1. To seek Members' approval for the capital programme of works in schools for 2005-2006 and the release of funding to support these schemes.

Information & Analysis

- 2. Annually the Department for Education & Skills (DfES) notifies all Local Authorities, including Darlington Borough Council, of their formulaic allocations of capital for education premises works. Notification of the 2005-2006 allocation was received in November 2004 and is shown in **Annex A**.
- 3. A plan for the capital works to be undertaken in our schools is set out and prioritised in line with the Authority's Asset Management Plan and takes into account schools' requirements, the Authority's priorities and national objectives.
- 4. Local support for these priorities is sought and further developed through local partnership agreements between schools and the Authority. The Authority agrees with schools through the Premises Interest Group, the priorities for major capital expenditure. Individually, each school agrees through the LAMPA process (Local Asset Management Partnership Agreements) the priorities for funding at a school level. This ensures all funding is targeted at the highest priority work and ownership at school level is achieved.
- 5. **Annex B** sets out the proposed projects for 2005-2006 highlighting our commitment to major capital projects, including the replacement Skerne Park Primary School and ongoing repair, maintenance and upgrading works to schools. Priority has again been given this year to the highest category of condition works and any health and safety issues within schools. These include rewiring projects, replacement of heating systems, inserting fire stops in roof voids and asbestos removal.

Outcome of Consultation

6. The proposed capital programme has been discussed with all schools through the education asset management planning process.

Legal Implications

7. This report has been considered by the Borough Solicitor for legal implications in accordance with the Council's approved procedures. There are no issues which the Borough Solicitor considers need to be brought to the specific attention of Members, other than those highlighted in the report.

Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998

8. The contents of this report have been considered in the context of the requirements placed on the Council by Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998, namely, the duty on the Council to exercise its functions with due regard to the likely effect of the exercise of those functions on, and the need to do all that it reasonably can to prevent, crime and disorder in its area. It is not considered that the contents of this report have any such effect.

Council Policy Framework

9. The issues contained within this report do not represent significant Council policy or a change in the Authority's framework.

Decision Deadline

10. For the purpose of the 'call-in' procedure this does not represent an urgent matter.

Conclusions

- 11. The report details the significant funding to be spent on building works in Darlington schools in 2005-2006. The Authority has secured over £5 million of investment in school buildings for the forthcoming year, which will see new schools built, refurbishment projects undertaken, accessibility to schools improved and the external fabric of schools secured.
- 12. The investment of over £5million demonstrates the authority's continued drive to deliver year on year improvements to education facilities for all pupils attending school in Darlington.

Recommendation

- 13. Cabinet are requested to:
 - (i) note the results of the Schools Capital Allocation Round 2005-2006 and the recent funding allocations; and
 - (ii) approve the capital programme of works in schools for 2005-2006, as in Annex B and the release of funding to support these schemes, as in Annex A.

Reason

14. To ensure the funding of over £5 million secured for Darlington schools can be directed at the most urgent building projects providing an improved environment for children to learn.
