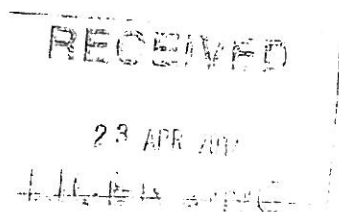
**GROUND FOR REVIEW**
