SUMMARY REPORT

Purpose of the Report

1. To seek Cabinet approval to add additional items to the Procurement Plan, to enable the procurement process to commence.

Summary

- 2. The Internal Planned Maintenance (IPM) flooring and electrical works were omitted from the previous Procurement Plan.
- 3. Since the Procurement Plan was agreed grant funding for the Active Travel Hub has been allocated to Council and also needs to be added to the Procurement Plan.
- 4. To enable the procurements to progress approval is sought to add the items to the current Procurement Plan, before the next report setting out the annual Procurement Plan is brought to Cabinet (in April 2017).

Recommendation

- 5. It is recommended that :-
 - (a) The items are added to the Procurement Plan (Appendix 1).
 - (b) The procurement's are deemed non-strategic (**Appendix 2**).
 - (c) The award of contract is delegated to the Direct of Neighbourhood Services and Resources in line with the Contract Procedure Rules.

MAIN REPORT

Information and Analysis

- 7. Under the Contract Procedure Rules one of the responsibilities of Cabinet is to agree the Procurement Plan. This involves consideration of whether contracts are classified as strategic. For those contracts that are strategic details of the proposed route that contracts will take will be set out and Cabinet will receive further reports on progress.
- 8. A set of criteria has been developed to assist in determining whether a contract should be deemed strategic or non-strategic. The criteria are based on value and significance with each category being scored between 1 (low significance) and 5 (high significance). Any contract with a value in excess of £5,000,000 is automatically deemed strategic. If the value of the contract falls below £5,000,000 but scores 15 or more on significance then that is also considered strategic. However Members and Officers may decide to recommend other than what the score suggests.
- 9. The IPM flooring and electrical works were omitted from the Procurement Plan.
- 10. The Council have been awarded funding for the Active Travel Hub. The funding is to provide cycling and walking activities across Darlington funded through the

Access Fund grant from the Department for Transport. These services will include as an example recycled bikes, cycle parking, cycle hire, guided walks and cycle rides, advice and information on active travel.

11. To enable the procurements to progress, approval is sought to add the items to the plan and for Cabinet to deem them non-strategic.

Procurement Advice

12. The procurements will be carried out through a tender process, via the NEPO Portal and advertised to a minimum of 5 suppliers in line with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules.
