- 6. To report on the outcomes of the Ofsted Inspection of services for children in need of help and protection, children looked after and care leavers in Darlington being undertaken between 23 June and 17 July 2015;
- 7. To examine the commissioning health service changes and receive a report on progress regarding the transition of commissioning to this authority and any implications budget or otherwise. The 0-5 years Children Services transfers to local authority commissioning responsibility in October and a report is scheduled to be considered by Cabinet on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2015.

# **Review Groups**

- 13. Child Poverty The final report with the findings and recommendations of the Review Group was approved by Scrutiny Members at their meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2015 and referred to Cabinet.
- 14. Cabinet at its meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2015 noted the findings and recommendations of the Review Group.
- 15. This Scrutiny will continue to monitor child poverty and receive updates on the work of the Darlington Partnership on the Inclusion Strategy.
- 16. STEM Applications and Apprenticeships Review This Review was established to examine what is being done to enable young people to understand the applications of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects and the opportunities that are available for apprenticeships and careers. Meetings were held in November and December, 2014 but no further meetings have been held. Members are asked to give consideration to the continuation of this Review Group.
