Members are now requested to consider the current status of the work programme and continue to suggest any further areas of work which Scrutiny would like to undertake taking into consideration the Improvement Plan and how this Scrutiny can monitor progress and provide challenge where needed in order to achieve the desired outcomes to improve the services to children and young people in the borough.
