Civil Contingencies

The Council has a statutory duty under the Civil Contingencies Act 2004 to risk assess, plan, train and exercise in preparation for emergencies. Costs have been reduced through the contract with Durham County Council to complete services on our behalf.

HOW DOES THE CORE OFFER BUDGET MEET THE COUNCIL'S OBLIGATIONS?

The Council carries out a range of functions to meet its statutory duty in partnership with other relevant bodies (such as the Police, Fire and Rescue Service, Public Health England, Environment Agency etc) to prepare for emergencies. These functions include assessing risk, preparing plans, training, exercising and warning and informing the public.
