Public libraries are governed by legislation ensuring that all members of society have free access to library materials. The first Public Libraries act was passed in 1850 and more recently the Public Libraries and Museums act of 1964 became law.

It states that it shall be the duty of every library authority to provide "a comprehensive and efficient library service for all persons desiring to make use thereof."

Statutory duties are set out in the act and include:

- The provision of books and other materials needed to achieve the provision of a comprehensive and efficient service
- Ensuring the means are in place to allow borrowing of or reference use of materials to meet users' requirements
- Encouraging users to make full use of the service and providing advice, bibliographic and other information to assist in this


