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

Re-referrals continue to remain low with 26 children, from 14 families, being re-referred to social care during Q2 2021/22. This equates to 10.7% of our referrals during this period having been repeated within 12 months. This is below the internal target of 18%.

5 of the 14 families that were re-referrals went straight to Strategy whilst the remaining progressed to a C&F assessment.






Of the 37 children (who were not transferred in), 26 had their Initial Child Protection Conferences (ICPC) within timescale (70.3%) during Q2 2021/22. 9 of these children who did not receive their conference in timescale were in September and include a sibling group of 7, and the ICPC was initially booked in time but then cancelled as it was deemed not required, although on further consideration a decision was made to go ahead with a conference, by which time it was out of timescale. 





Total number of new cases of children coming into care within the year





CHILDREN IN CARE - ALLOCATION & REVIEWS

The percentage of Children in Care cases which should have been reviewed during the year ending 31 March that were reviewed on time during the year and the percentage of Children in Care cases that were allocated to a qualified Social Worker at the end of the month.

To improve compliance with local authorities' legal requirements under the Review of Children's cases Regulations 1991. The purpose of the review is to consider the plan for the child's welfare, to monitor the progress of the plan and amend it as necessary in light of changed information and circumstances. The statutory intervals are within 20 working days of placement, then within 3 months and 6 monthly thereafter, but reviews may be rescheduled or held inside these intervals if there are significant changes to the child's care plan.

DEFINITION

Percentage of Children in Care who had all statutory visits completed within required timescales and percentage of Children in Care's statutory visits completed within timescales each month and year to date.

During Q2 2021/22, 92.9% (691 / 744) of statutory visits for Children in Care (CiC) were completed in timescale. This is a small decrease compared with Q2 2020/21 when there were 93.2% of visits completed in timescale.



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75.7% (87 / 115) of children due a dental check assessment by end of Q2 2021 have had one completed, with the recovery continuing from the low levels when dental practices were closed due to Covid-19 lockdown.

Of the 28 children who did not have a dental check, 3 (2.6% of the total cohort) of them are refusing to have one completed at this time. Although they are refusing, they are continually reminded of the benefits of having a check-up and encouraged to take part.
