*Disabled Facilities Grant	The Disabled Facilities Grant (DFG) is a means tested statutory grant provided by the Government to provide adaptations such as showers, stair lifts, ramps, or building extensions for disabled adults or children to enable them to live independently in their own homes. (Capital Grant)	£1,063,345	Cabinet approved a revised DFG Policy (2002-23) & Regulatory Reform Order 2002) on 10 November 2020. This allowed the Council to adopt a more flexible approach and broaden approach to how the DFG Grant is used.
^Better Care Fund	The Better Care Fund (BCF) is a programme spanning both the NHS and Local Government which seeks to join-up health and care services, so that people can manage their own health and wellbeing and live independently in their communities for as long as possible. The Fund is one of the government's national vehicles for driving health and social care integration. It requires clinical commissioning groups (CCGs) and local government to agree a joint plan, owned by the Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB).	£13,001,670	As stated in the MTFP- a reduction in the RSG funded an improved Better Care Fund-initially a 3- year fund but continued into 20/21 and 21/22 and confirmed 22/23.
