Thursday, 20 July 2023	Report to the Ordinary Meeting of the Council requesting endorsement of the process for the Review of Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations.
2023 Monday, 24 July 2023	Electoral Services Staff to undertake preparatory steps. For example:  (a) Start compiling statistics and information which may assist them during the review. These may include:  (i) Electorate figures, broken down to street level within wards and existing polling districts.  (ii) Any local authority or national statistics that estimate population change within the area.  (iii) In England and Wales, a report from the authority's planning section detailing any proposed areas of new development and the approximate number of dwellings and expected population numbers for those areas.  (iv) Detailed up-to-date maps of a scale that will assist in the designation of polling district boundaries.  (v) Details of current polling places and an indication as to their overall suitability for purpose (including, for example, any surveys, diagrams or photographs completed with the assistance of Presiding Officers or polling station inspectors or as part of a previous review or post-election evaluation).
	<ul> <li>Further guidance can be found under 'Assessing the current arrangements and proposals for change'.</li> <li>(vi) Any comments or complaints regarding the current arrangements from the public, elected members or other bodies.</li> <li>(vii) Up-to-date information gained from the existing and possible future polling station venue managers as to continued availability (highlighting, for example, planned renovation work or other future plans).</li> </ul>

	(viii) Details of potential alternative buildings (public, private or temporary type constructions) that might appear suitable.
	(ix) Advice and guidance from local disability groups and disability organisations (such as, for example, DAD, SCOPE, etc.), and any expert help from officers within the council who are responsible for equality schemes.
	(x) Terms of reference and the criteria for assessing the suitability of the current/proposed arrangements.
Monday, 2 October 2023	Publication of Notice advising of commencement of Review of Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations. The Notice will state:
	<ul> <li>That the local authority is conducting a Review of Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations;</li> <li>That the Returning Officer will make comment on existing and proposed Polling Districts and Polling Places;</li> <li>That electors within the local authority area, or the UK Parliamentary constituencies of Darlington and Sedgefield, may make a representation;</li> <li>That the local authority would welcome any person or body with expertise in access for persons with any type of disability to make representation or to comment on the authority's existing proposals, the Returning Officer's representation, or any other related matter;</li> <li>That persons or bodies making representations should, if possible, suggest alternative places that may be used as Polling Places;</li> <li>The postal address, e-mail address and website address at which documents can be inspected and representations made; and</li> <li>An indication of the timetable of the Review, and a deadline for representations.</li> </ul>

Monday, 2 October 2023	Commencement of Consultation period on <b>existing and pre-identified potential alternatives</b> for Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations. Consultation should include:

5pm, Sunday, 12 November 2023	Close of initial consultation period on existing and pre-identified potential alternatives for Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations.
Monday, 13 November 2023 to Sunday, 26 November 2023	Finalised proposals drafted taking into consideration premise inspections; consideration of any suggested alternative places submitted; the comments of the Returning Officer, etc.
Monday, 27 November 2023	Consultation period on <b>finalised proposals</b> for Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations. Consultation should again include:  Returning Officer; MPs; All Ward Councillors; Parish Councils; Darlington Association on Disability; GOLD;
