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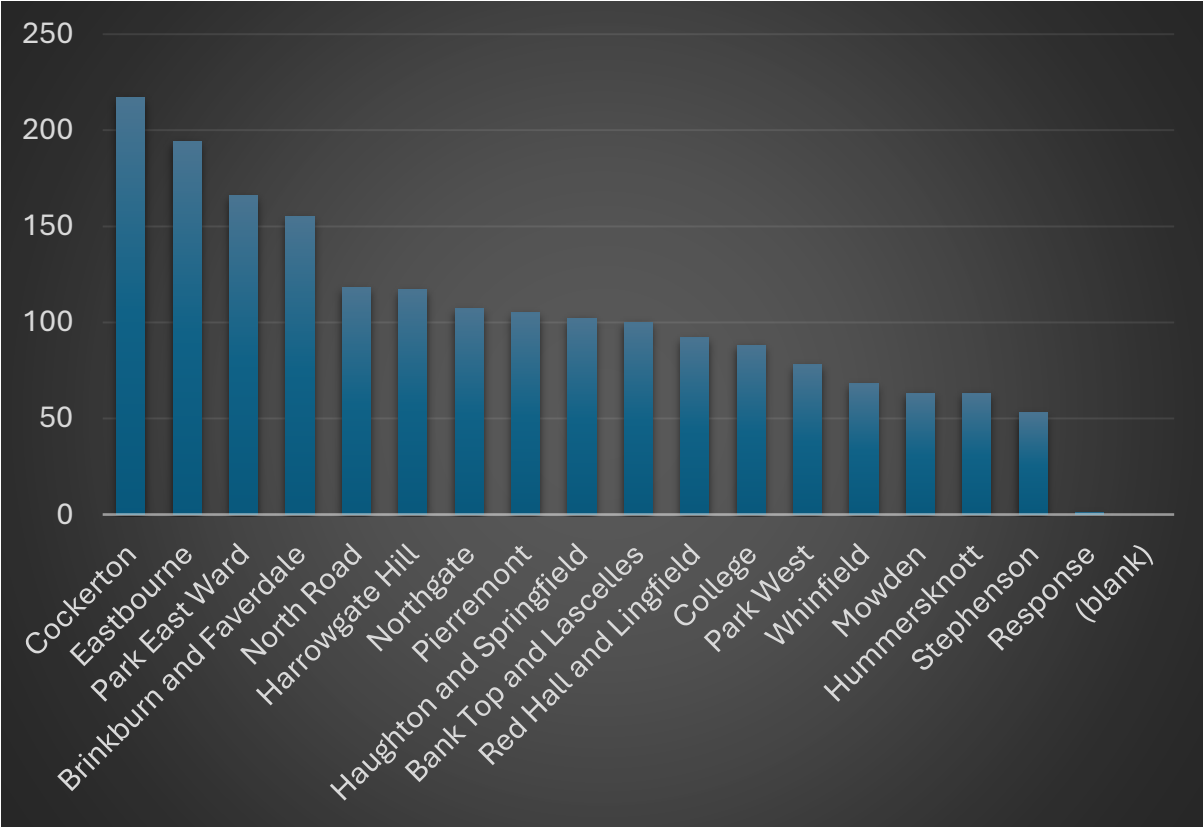

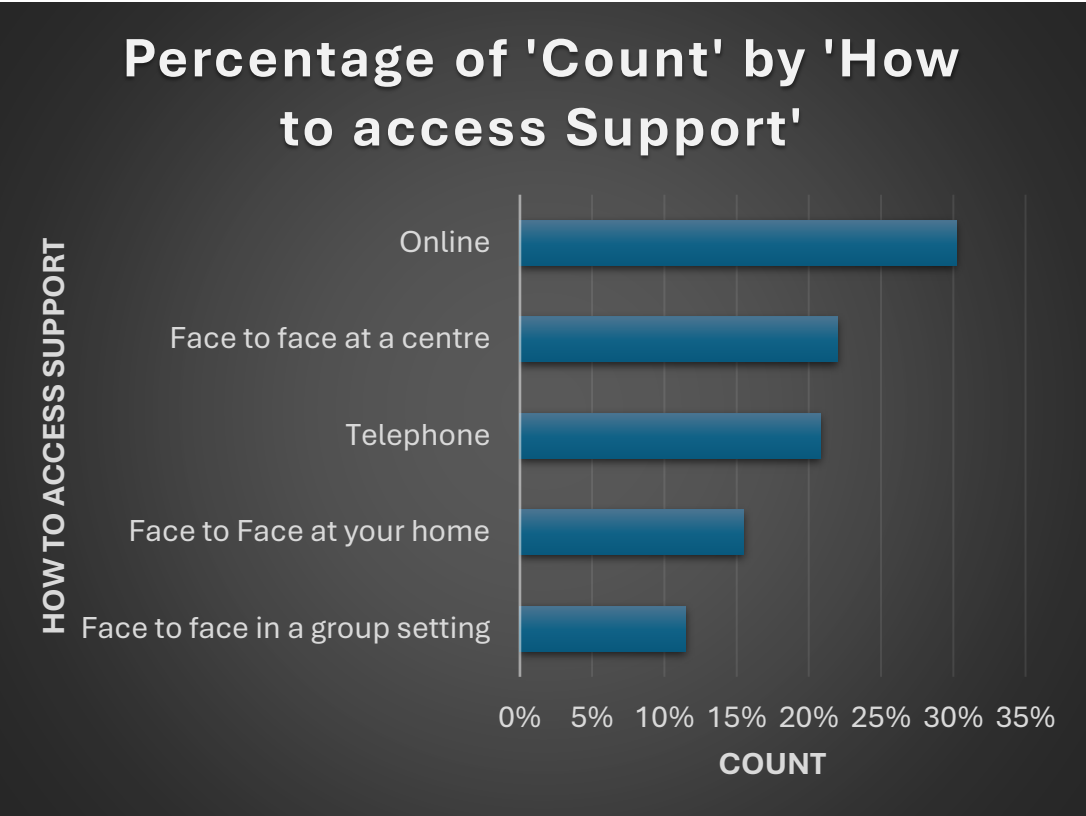


Perhaps most interestingly, only 1175 respondents (53%) stated they did not need support of *any kind*.

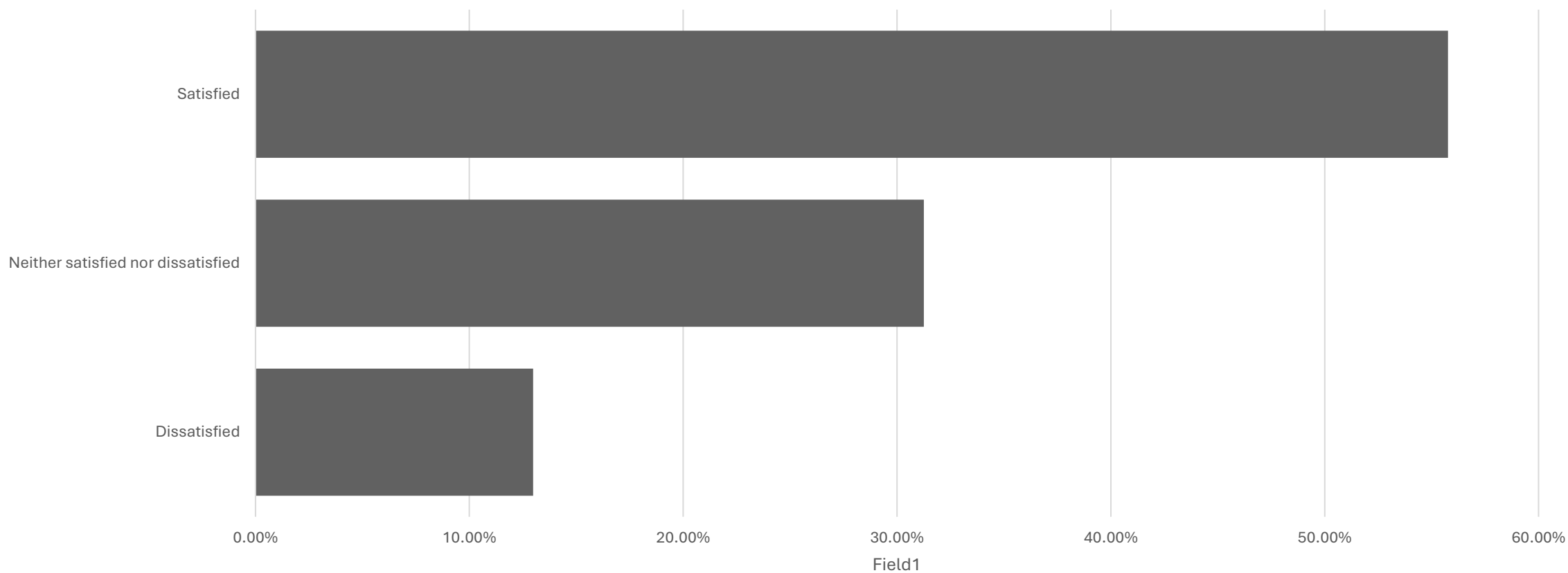

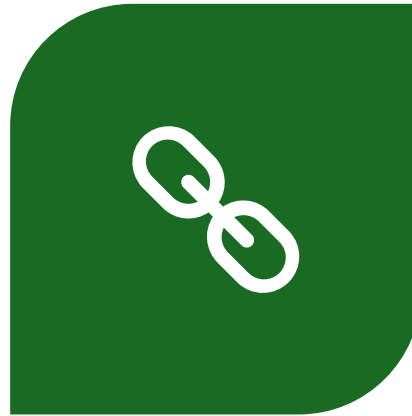
