Section 106 Funding

- 6. The Council holds the following Section 106 education contributions:
 - £581,183.20 for the 'provision of additional primary educational places within the MSG area' (15/00976/OUT Land off Station Road)
 - £93,171.39 a 'contribution towards the provision of additional primary education places within the Middleton St George area' (16/00972/FUL Middleton Lane)
 - £54,450.86 'to provide additional Primary Education places' (17/00847/FUL Yarm Road)
 - £169,285.19 'towards the expansion of St George's Church Primary School' (16/00396/OUT Lancaster House)
- 7. The 2025 school place planning projections forecast that the school will fall below 5% surplus capacity by 2029/30 with only 17 surplus places to meet growing demand. Due to the school's village location, there should be no impact on other schools.
- 8. Subject to Cabinet approval it is proposed that St George's CE Academy use the Section 106 funding to expand and improve provision at their growing primary school, where pupil numbers have increased significantly as a result of recent housing developments. The investment will focus on extending their EYFS provision to ensure sufficient, high-quality Reception spaces for new families, upgrading and securing the KS1 playground to increase capacity, enhance safety, and support purposeful play and outdoor learning. In addition, the project will create a dedicated SEND room within the school to provide targeted support and interventions for children with additional needs, alongside the development of a bespoke outdoor SEND area designed to offer a safe, structured environment for sensory and therapeutic activities. Together, these improvements will ensure the school can continue to meet the needs of its expanding community and provide an inclusive, nurturing environment for all pupils.
- 9. These funds are due to expire May 2035, July 2032, May 2026 and February 2027 respectively, and if unused will have to be returned to their respective developers.
- 10. Any capital works undertaken using the Section 106 funding will be delivered by, and in consultation with, the academy trust.

11. All funding with be paid through DBC grant agreements to the setting concerned.
