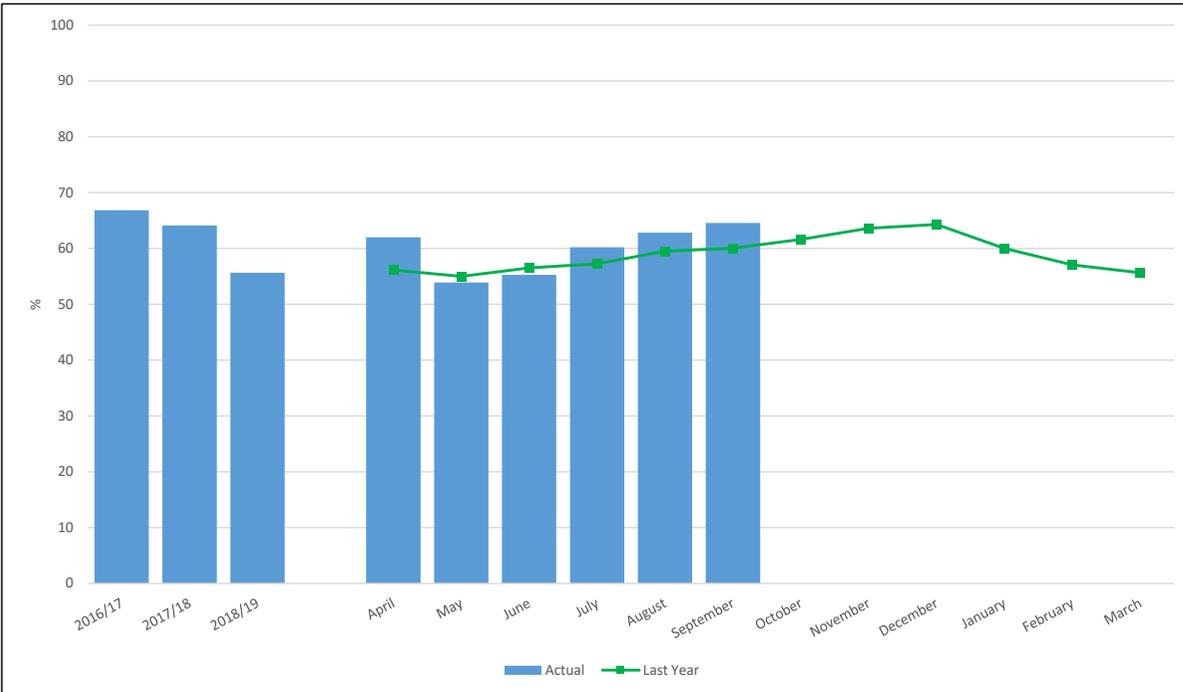

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Performance Analysis	<p>Since April the percentage of clients who have completed a reablement package with an outcome of 'No Service Provided or Identified, Long Term Support Ended or Universal Services/Signposted' is 64.6%. In terms of actual numbers out of the 268 clients who have completed a reablement package 173 had no ongoing care needs.</p> <p>During Quarter 2 performance in this indicator has improved month on month. This improvement can be evidenced when comparing Quarter 1 performance against Quarter 2. During Quarter 1 the percentage of people with no ongoing care needs was 55.3% whilst during Quarter 2 it was 64%. The appointment of a new team leader within RIACT has had a positive impact on the performance of this indicator. There are now twice weekly meetings being held with staff which is providing support, guidance and a clear direction of how the service is expected to develop.</p> <p>There are no benchmarking figures available for this indicator.</p>

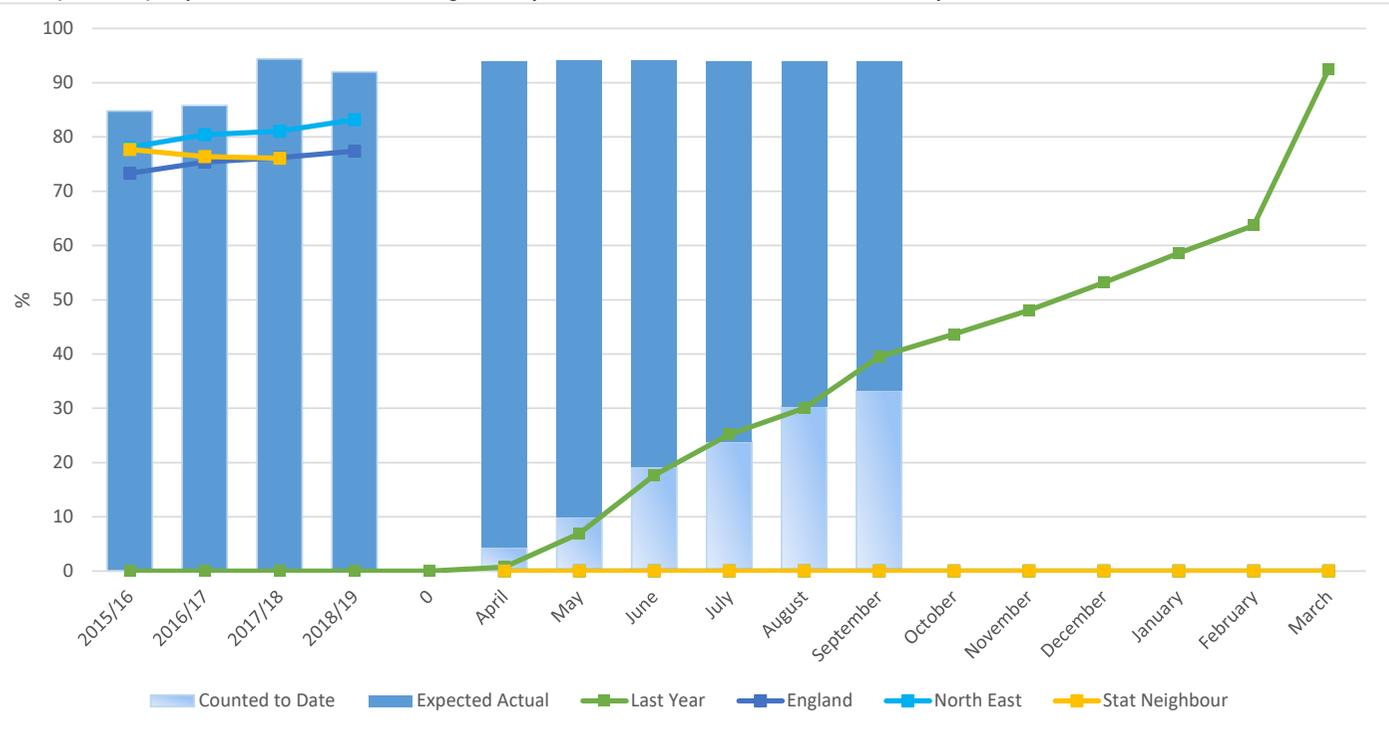
Performance Analysis
 In terms of actual figures out of the 279 working aged clients who have a learning disability and receiving long term support 262 are recorded as being in settled accommodation. Since April there were 93 clients accommodation statuses captured as either living in their own home or with family. Therefore the proportion of adults with a learning disability living in settled accommodation where the information has been captured since April is 33.3%, actual performance is expected to be 94%.

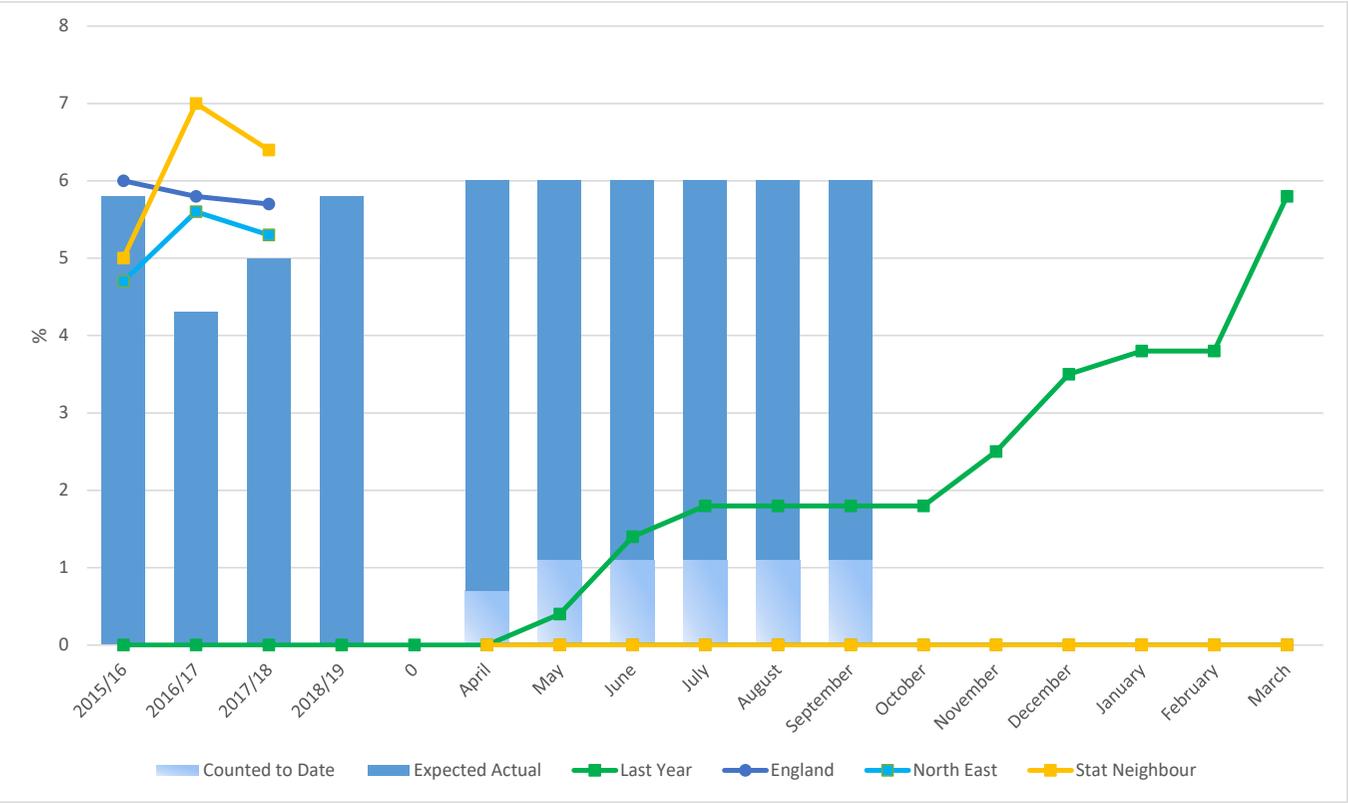
Performance Analysis
 In terms of actual figures out of the 279 working aged clients who have a learning disability and receiving long term support 17 are recorded as being in paid employment. Since April 2019 there were 3 clients statuses captured as being in paid employment. Therefore the proportion of adults with a learning disability living in paid employment where the information has been captured since April is 1.1%, actual performance is expected to be 6% at the end of the year.
 Due to the settled nature of this cohort it is anticipated that the majority of reviews will be completed in the last 2 quarters.

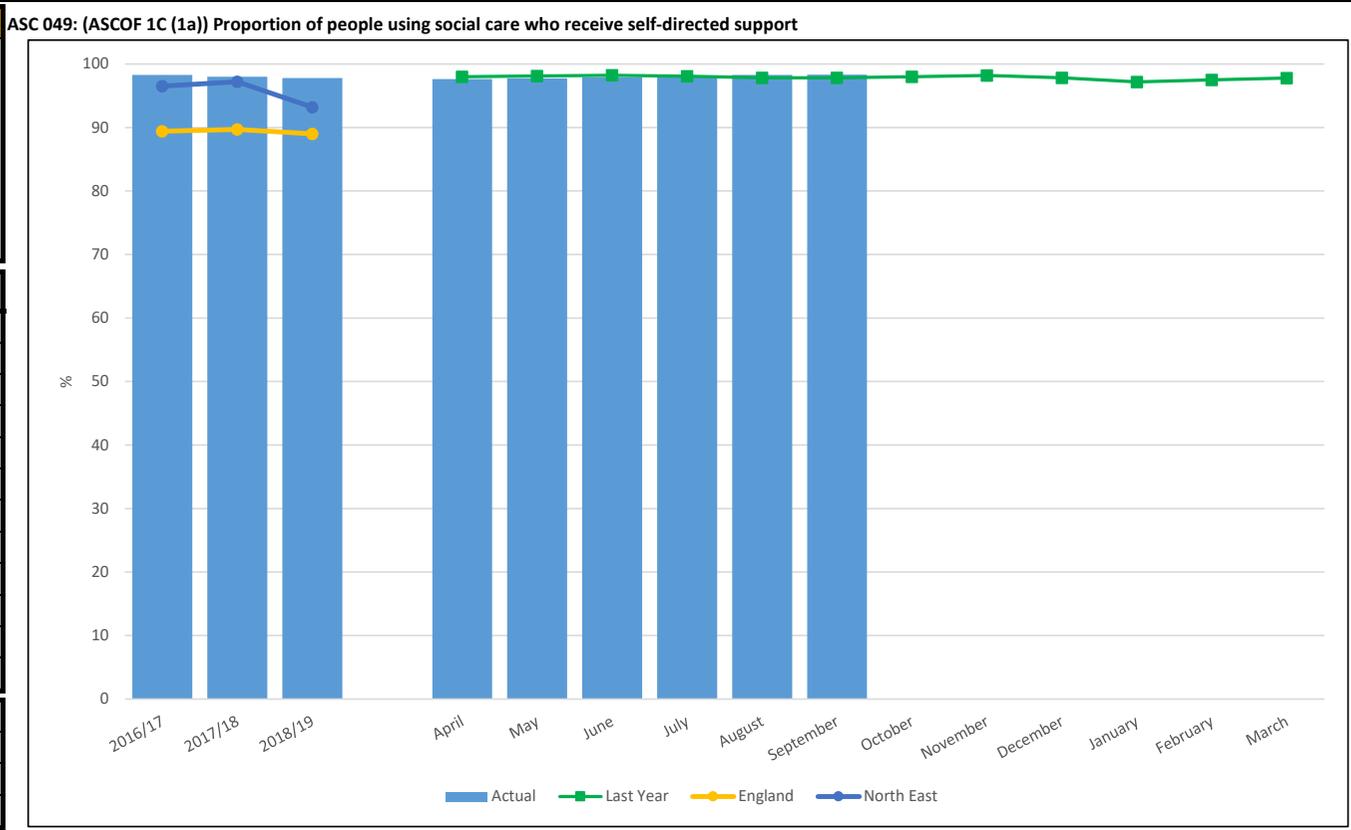

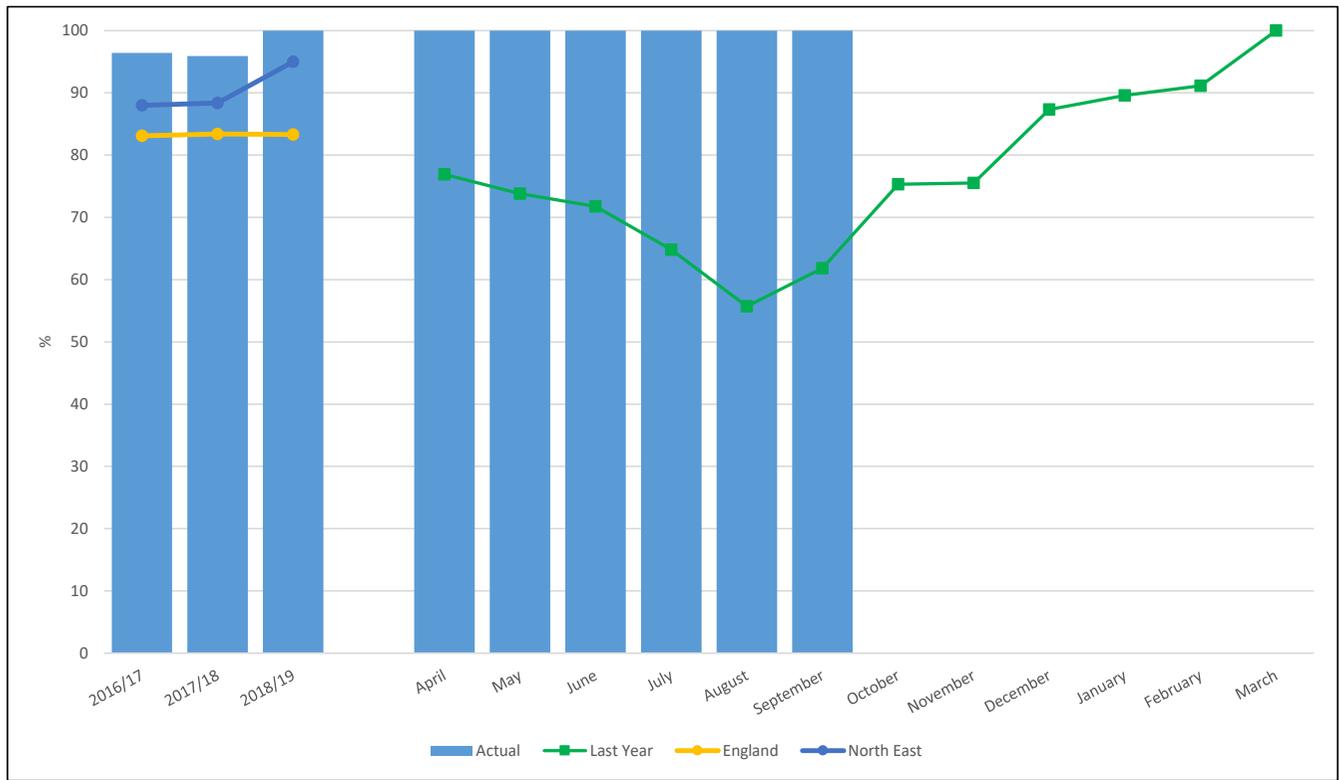

 Since April the proportion of carers using social care who receive self-directed support is 100%. In terms of actual numbers this equates to 90 carers receiving self-directed support.
 All carers who are in receipt of a commissioned service are now recorded as having a personal budget, therefore this indicator should always be recorded as 100% of carers being in receipt of self-directed support.

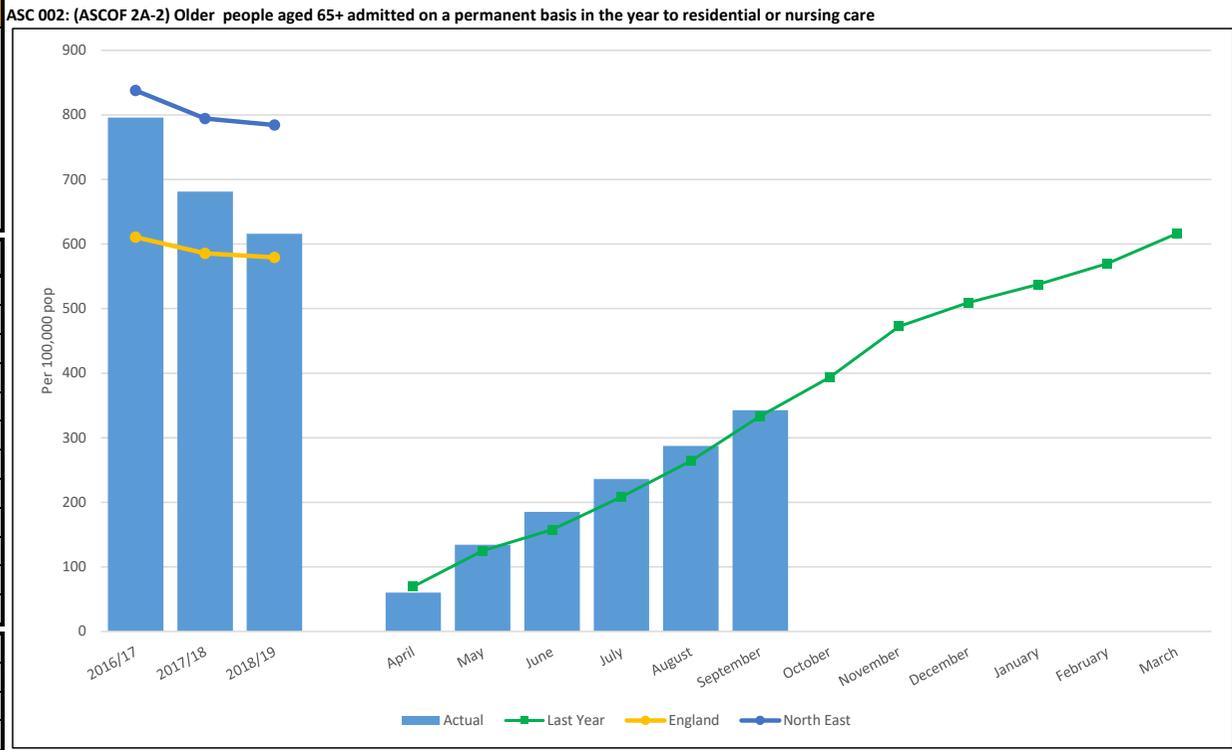

Performance Analysis
 Since April the number of 65+ who have been permanently admitted to residential care is 74 (343 per 100,000 population).
 The proposed level for ASC 002 is 600 (per 100,000 population) which equates to approximately 128 clients being admitted by the end of the year. There is a monthly monitoring rate of approximately 10 clients or less. Currently the average number of permanent admissions per month is 12, which is on par with 2018/19 levels.
 Validation forum continues to be assured that cases presented with a request for a permanent admission are appropriate.
 The data on the following page shows Darlington's 2018/19 performance compared to our regional neighbours. The information is taken from the 2018/19 ASCOF Return. The figures show that out of the 12 regional authorities Darlington is currently 4th.

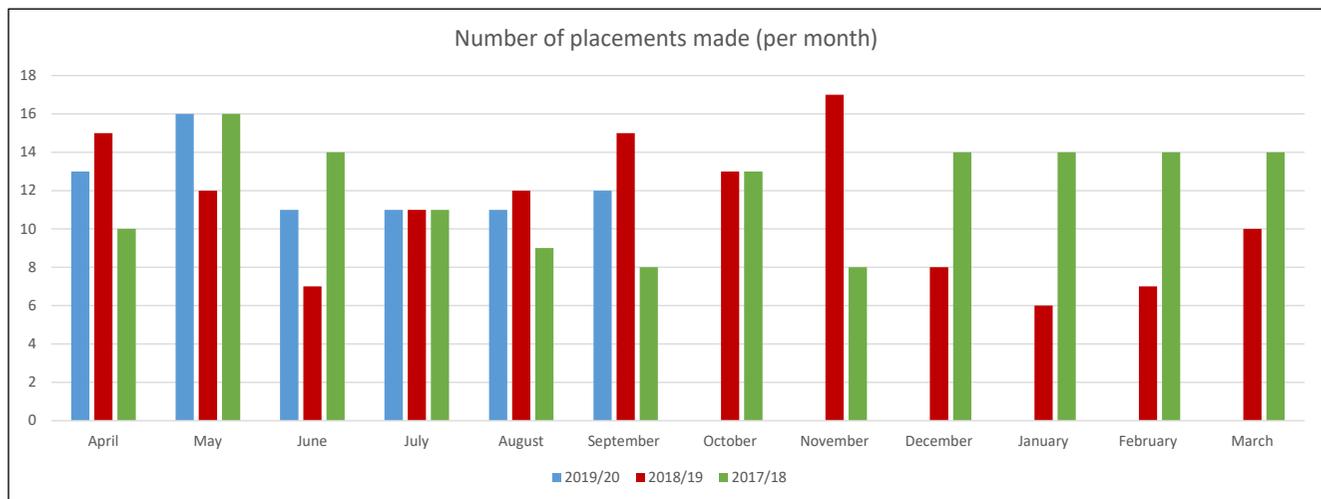

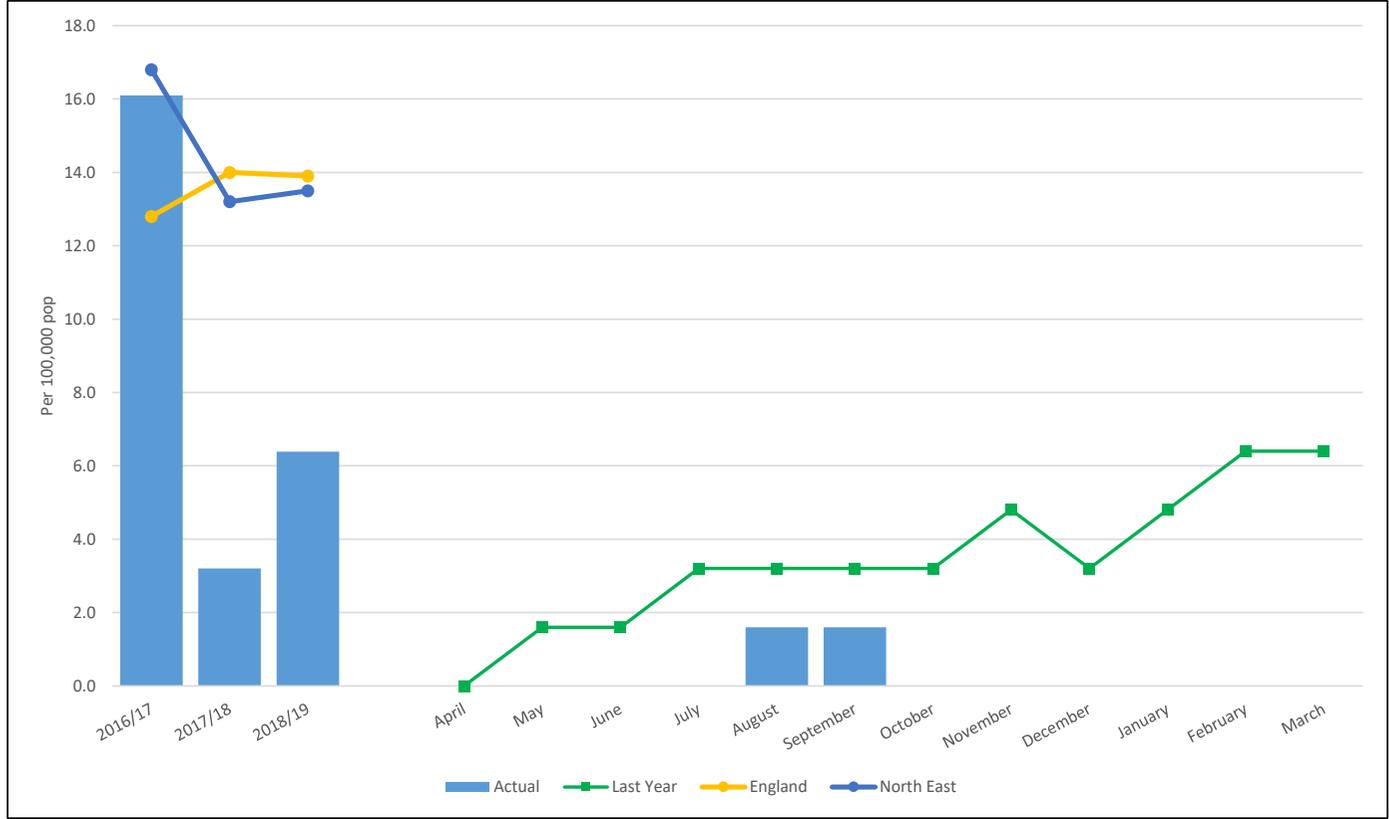
Performance Analysis

 The suggested target for ASC 003 is 8 (per 100,000 pop), this equates to 5 permanent admissions during the year. The cumulative target at the end of September is 2, our actual admissions now sits at 1. This performance continues to evidence the robust assurance by Team Managers and Validation Forum.

There have been 79 safeguarding initial enquiries started in September 2019, which is less than the previous 4 months this year but more than the same time last year (56 in Sept 2018). YTD Total for 2019-20 is 521 whereas this time last year the YTD for 2018-19 was 492 . Q2 2019-20 is 270 and Q1 2019-20 was 251.

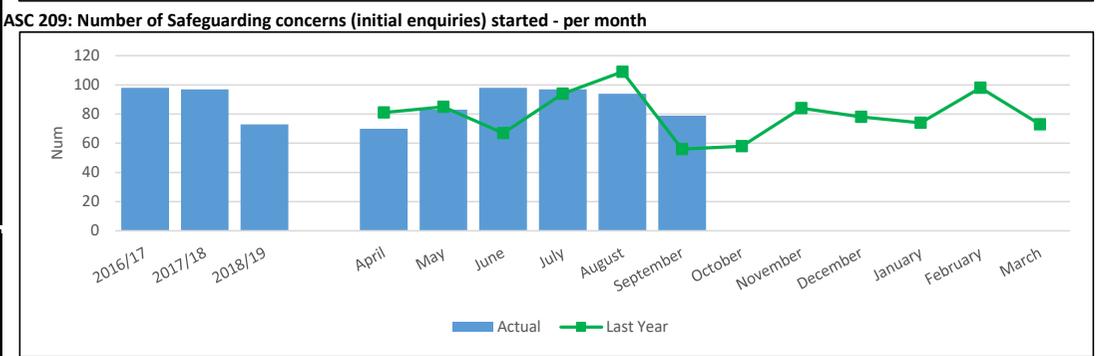
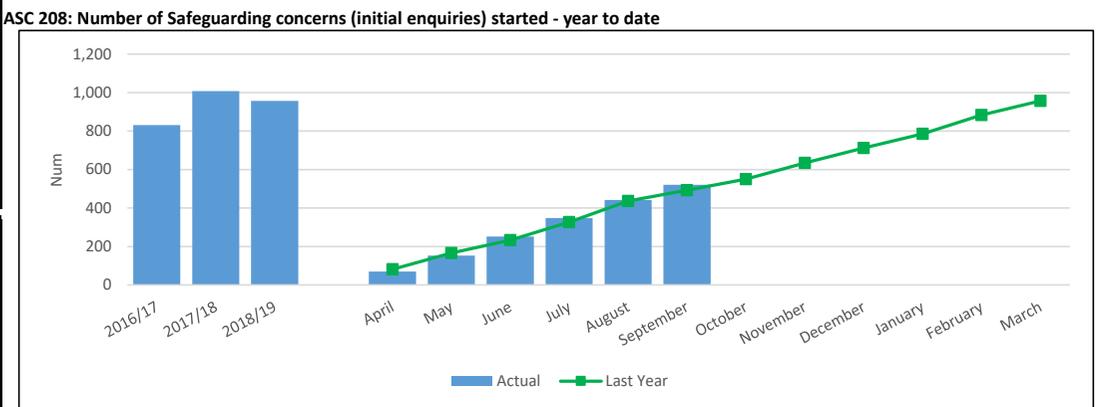

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Performance Analysis

112 of the 521 safeguarding initial enquiries started since April have progressed to strategy. That is a 21.4% conversion rate since the beginning of the year.

Exception reports are begin sent out on a fortnightly basis to Senior Management Team to highlight any initial enquiries that are incomplete and need progressing to strategy sooner (within 5 working days).

There is no target set for this indicator but it is suggested that a 20% conversion rate is the level to aim for performance.
